A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state departments
2 and agencies from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund,
3 environment first fund, and tobacco settlement trust fund,
4 relating to the capitol complex parking structure, and
5 authorizing fees.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I
REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND
STATE BOARD OF REGENTS

Section 1. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the state board of regents for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

- 1. For completion of the girls' dormitory at the Iowa school for the deaf:
..... \$ 100,000
- 2. For electrical and plumbing upgrades, repair of classrooms and the auditorium, and restoration of the auditorium at the Iowa braille and sight saving school:
..... \$ 100,000

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of corrections for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

- For costs of entering into a lease-purchase agreement to connect the electrical system supporting the special needs unit at Fort Madison:
..... \$ 333,168

DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

- 1. For historical site preservation grants, to be used for the restoration, preservation, and development of historical sites:
..... \$ 830,000

1 Historical site preservation grants shall only be awarded
2 for projects which meet the definition of "vertical
3 infrastructure" in section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c".

4 In making grants pursuant to this subsection, the
5 department shall consider the existence and amount of other
6 funds available to an applicant for the designated project.
7 Each grant awarded from moneys appropriated in this subsection
8 shall not exceed \$100,000 per project. Not more than two
9 grants may be awarded in each county.

11 battle flag advisory committee to stabilize the condition of
12 the battle flag collection, notwithstanding section 8.57,
13 subsection 5, paragraph "c":

17 kiosk, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

21 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
22 infrastructure fund to the department of economic development,
23 or the Iowa finance authority, as designated, for the fiscal
24 year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the
25 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
26 used for the purposes designated:

27 1. To the department of economic development for deposit
28 in the local housing assistance program fund created in
29 section 15.354, or, if the housing trust fund is created
30 within the Iowa finance authority by the Eightieth General
31 Assembly, 2003 Session, to the Iowa finance authority for
32 deposit in the housing trust fund, notwithstanding section
33 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

35 2. For accelerated career education program capital

1 projects at community colleges that are authorized under
2 chapter 260G and that meet the definition of "vertical
3 infrastructure" in section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
4 \$ 3,000,000
5 The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be
6 allocated equally among the community colleges in the state.
7 If any portion of the equal allocation to a community college
8 is not obligated or encumbered by April 1, 2004, the
9 unobligated and unencumbered portions shall be available for
10 use by other community colleges.

11 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

12 Sec. 5. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
13 infrastructure fund to the department of education for the
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004,
15 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
16 be used for the purpose designated:

17 To provide resources for structural and technological
18 improvements to local libraries, notwithstanding section 8.57,
19 subsection 5, paragraph "c":
20 \$ 600,000

21 DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

22 Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
23 infrastructure fund to the department of general services, or
24 any successor agency, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
25 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amounts, or so
26 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
27 designated:

28 1. For costs associated with the remodeling of the records
29 and property center:
30 \$ 4,750,000

31 2. For costs associated with the planning for the vacation
32 and demolition of the Wallace building:
33 \$ 50,000

34 3. For routine maintenance of state buildings and
35 facilities, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5,

1 paragraph "c":

2 \$ 1,664,000

3 4. For relocation and transition costs directly associated
4 with renovation of the records and property building,
5 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

6 \$ 729,237

7 The move and relocation associated with renovation of the
8 records and property building shall not commence until April
9 1, 2004.

10 5. For facility lease payments for the department of
11 corrections, the Iowa department of public health, and the
12 department of public safety, notwithstanding section 8.57,
13 subsection 5, paragraph "c":

14 \$ 631,449

15 6. To provide matching funds for construction
16 of the medical and education building for a child
17 treatment center located in a county with a population
18 between 189,000 and 196,000:

19 \$ 250,000

20 7. For construction and display of permanent exhibits for
21 the statewide African-American museum located in Linn county,
22 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

23 \$ 300,000

24 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT

25 Sec. 7. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
26 infrastructure fund to the information technology department,
27 or any successor agency, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
28 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amount, or so
29 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose
30 designated:

31 For technology improvement projects, notwithstanding
32 section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

33 \$ 2,000,000

34 Of the amount appropriated in this section, \$250,000 is
35 allocated to maintain and operate the enterprise warehouse

1 technology project and \$65,000 is allocated to the division of
2 criminal and juvenile justice planning of the department of
3 human rights for 1.00 full-time equivalent position to provide
4 support for the justice data warehouse technology project.

5 IOWA TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION

6 Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
7 infrastructure fund to the Iowa telecommunications and
8 technology commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
9 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amount, or so
10 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose
11 designated:

12 For maintenance and lease costs associated with Part III
13 connections, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5,
14 paragraph "c":

15 \$ 2,727,000

16 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

17 Sec. 9. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
18 infrastructure fund to the department of public defense for
19 the designated fiscal years the following amounts, or so much
20 thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
21 designated:

22 1. For planning and design of a national guard readiness
23 center in or near Iowa City:

24 FY 2003-2004..... \$ 195,000

25 2. For planning, design, and construction of a national
26 guard readiness center in or near Fort Dodge:

27 FY 2003-2004..... \$ 750,000

28 FY 2004-2005..... \$ 750,000

29 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

30 Sec. 10. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
31 infrastructure fund to the department of public safety for the
32 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004,
33 the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
34 be used for the purposes designated:

35 1. For capitol building and judicial building security,

1 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
2 \$ 800,000

3 2. To the division of fire safety of the department for
4 allocation to the fire service training bureau for the
5 planning, design, and construction of regional training
6 facilities in the state:

7 \$ 50,000

8 STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

9 Sec. 11. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
10 infrastructure fund to the state department of transportation
11 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June
12 30, 2004, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
13 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated,
14 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

15 For operation and maintenance of the network of automated
16 weather observation and data transfer systems associated with
17 the Iowa aviation weather system, the runway marking program
18 for public airports, the windsock program for public airports,
19 and the aviation improvement program:

20 \$ 500,000

21 Sec. 12. PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TUITION. There is
22 appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the
23 state board of regents for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
24 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amount, or so
25 much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the purpose
26 designated:

27 For allocation by the state board of regents to the state
28 university of Iowa, the Iowa state university of science and
29 technology, and the university of northern Iowa to reimburse
30 the institutions for deficiencies in their operating funds
31 resulting from the pledging of tuitions, student fees and
32 charges, and institutional income to finance the cost of
33 providing academic and administrative buildings and facilities
34 and utility services at the institutions, notwithstanding
35 section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

2 Sec. 13. REVERSION. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys
3 appropriated in this division of this Act shall not revert at
4 the close of the fiscal year for which they were appropriated
5 but shall remain available for the purposes designated until
6 the close of the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2006, or
7 until the project for which the appropriation was made is
8 completed, whichever is earlier.

9 Sec. 14. 2002 Iowa Acts, Second Extraordinary Session,
10 chapter 1001, section 6, is amended to read as follows:

11 SEC. 6. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS -- ENGINEERING COMPLEX --
12 BONDING.

13 There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure
14 fund to the state board of regents for the fiscal year
15 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the
16 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
17 used for the purpose designated:

18 For repayment of the bonding for the phase II construction
19 of the engineering teaching and research complex at Iowa state
20 university of science and technology, as authorized in this
21 section:

22 \$ 770007000
23 0

24 Moneys appropriated in this section are not subject to
25 transfer.

26 1. The state board of regents is authorized to issue bonds
27 as provided in chapter 262A in an amount not exceeding \$7
28 million, except as provided in subsection 2, to undertake and
29 carry out completion of the engineering teaching and research
30 phase II construction at Iowa state university of science and
31 technology and to finance the remaining cost of the project.

32 2. Notwithstanding the limitation established in
33 subsection 1, the amount of bonds issued as authorized in
34 subsection 1 may be exceeded by the amount the state board of
35 regents determines to be necessary to capitalize interest,

1 bond reserves, and issuance costs.

2 Sec. 15. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204, section 6,
3 unnumbered paragraph 2, as amended by 2000 Iowa Acts, chapter
4 1225, section 13, is amended to read as follows:

5 For planning, design, and construction of a new judicial
6 building:

7 FY 1999-2000..... \$ 10,000,000

8 FY 2000-2001..... \$ 8,000,000

9 Of the amount appropriated in this section for FY 2000-
10 2001, up to \$400,000 may be used by the judicial branch for
11 costs associated with operation of the judicial building,
12 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c".

14 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND

15 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

16 Sec. 16. There is appropriated from the environment first
17 fund to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for
18 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30,
19 2004, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
20 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

21 1. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to
22 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of
23 intercepting tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss,
24 improving water quality, and enhancing agricultural production
25 practices:

26 \$ 1,500,000

27 2. For continuation of a program that provides multi-
28 objective resource protections for flood control, water
29 quality, erosion control, and natural resource conservation:

30 \$ 2,700,000

31 3. For continuation of a statewide voluntary farm
32 management demonstration program to demonstrate the
33 effectiveness and adaptability of emerging practices in
34 agronomy that protect water resources and provide other
35 environmental benefits:

1 \$ 850,000

2 4. For deposit in the alternative drainage system
3 assistance fund created in section 460.303 to be used for
4 purposes of supporting the alternative drainage system
5 assistance program as provided in section 460.304:

6 \$ 500,000

7 5. To provide financial assistance for the establishment
8 of permanent soil and water conservation practices:

9 \$ 5,500,000

10 a. Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in
11 this subsection may be allocated for cost-sharing to abate
12 complaints filed under section 161A.47.

13 b. Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, 5
14 percent shall be allocated for financial incentives to
15 establish practices to protect watersheds above publicly owned
16 lakes of the state from soil erosion and sediment as provided
17 in section 161A.73.

18 c. Not more than 30 percent of a district's allocation of
19 moneys as financial incentives may be provided for the purpose
20 of establishing management practices to control soil erosion
21 on land that is row-cropped, including but not limited to no-
22 till planting, ridge-till planting, contouring, and contour
23 strip-cropping as provided in section 161A.73.

24 d. The state soil conservation committee created in
25 section 161A.4 may allocate moneys appropriated in this
26 subsection to conduct research and demonstration projects to
27 promote conservation tillage and nonpoint source pollution
28 control practices.

29 e. The financial incentive payments may be used in
30 combination with department of natural resources moneys.

31 f. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
32 this subsection may be used for costs of administration and
33 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

34 6. To encourage and assist farmers in enrolling in the
35 continuous sign-up federal conservation reserve program and

1 work with them to enhance their revegetation efforts to
2 improve water quality and habitat:

3 \$ 2,000,000

4 7. For deposit in the loess hills development and
5 conservation fund created in section 161D.2:

6 \$ 600,000

7 Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, \$400,000
8 shall be allocated to the hungry canyons account and \$200,000
9 shall be allocated to the loess hills alliance account, to be
10 used for the purposes for which the moneys in those accounts
11 are authorized to be used under chapter 161D.

12 No more than five percent of the moneys appropriated in

32 year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the
33 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
34 used for the purposes designated:

35 1. To provide local watershed managers with geographic

1 information system data for their use in developing,
2 monitoring, and displaying results of their watershed work:
3 \$ 195,000

4 2. For statewide coordination of volunteer efforts under
5 the water quality and keepers of the land programs:
6 \$ 100,000

7 3. For continuing the establishment and operation of water
8 quality monitoring stations:
9 \$ 2,955,000

10 4. For deposit in the administration account of the water
11 quality protection fund, to carry out the purposes of that

16 is not obligated or encumbered by April 1, 2004, the
17 unobligated and unencumbered portions shall be available for
18 use by other community colleges.

19 2. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

20 For allocation to the public broadcasting division for
21 costs of installation of digital television for Iowa public
22 television facilities, notwithstanding section 12E.12,

3 b. Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, \$200,000
4 may be used for costs associated with the vertical
5 infrastructure program, notwithstanding section 12E.12,
6 subsection 1, paragraph "b", subparagraph (1).

7 4. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT (or any successor
8 agency)

9 For the payment of claims relating to the purchase and
10 implementation of an integrated information for Iowa system:
11 \$ 6,131,075

12 5. IOWA STATE FAIR AUTHORITY

13 For vertical infrastructure improvements on the state
14 fairgrounds:
15 \$ 500,000

16 6. DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

17 a. For costs associated with the planning, design, and
18 construction of a premier destination park, notwithstanding
19 section 12E.12, subsection 1, paragraph "b", subparagraph (1):
20 \$ 3,000,000

21 The appropriation in this paragraph "a" is contingent upon
22 receipt by the department of a funding commitment by June 30,
23 2005, from a private developer for development of the proposed
24 honey creek resort areas near the premier destination park.

25 b. For continuation of the restore the outdoors program,
26 notwithstanding section 12E.12, subsection 1, paragraph "b",
27 subparagraph (1):
28 \$ 2,500,000

29 7. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

30 a. For maintenance and repair of national guard armories

1 8. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

2 For improvements to the capitol complex security system,
3 notwithstanding section 12E.12, subsection 1, paragraph "b",
4 subparagraph (1):

5 \$ 1,000,000

6 9. STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

7 a. For vertical infrastructure improvements at the
8 commercial air service airports within the state:

9 \$ 1,100,000

10 One-half of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "a"
11 shall be allocated equally between each commercial service
12 airport, 40 percent of the funds shall be allocated based on
13 the percentage that the number of enplaned passengers at each
14 commercial service airport bears to the total number of
15 enplaned passengers in the state during the previous fiscal
16 year, and 10 percent of the funds shall be allocated based on
17 the percentage that the air cargo tonnage at each commercial

17 remain available for the purposes designated until the close
18 of the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2006, or until the
19 project for which the appropriation was made is completed,
20 whichever is earlier.

21 Sec. 22. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS -- USE OF
22 APPROPRIATIONS -- REVERSION.

23 1. There is appropriated from the tax-exempt bond proceeds
24 restricted capital funds account of the tobacco settlement
25 trust fund to the department of corrections for the fiscal
26 period beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2006, the
27 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
28 used for the purpose designated:

29 For construction of a 170-bed facility at the Iowa medical
30 and classification center at Oakdale:

10 appropriated from the tax-exempt bond proceeds restricted

12 the state to the state board of regents for the fiscal year
13 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the
14 following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to
15 be used for the purpose designated:

16 For allocation by the state board of regents to the state

18 technology, and the university of northern Iowa to reimburse
19 the institutions for deficiencies in their operating funds

30 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the
31 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
32 used for the purpose designated:

33 For payment of litigation fees incurred pursuant to the
34 tobacco master settlement agreement:

1 Sec. 25. IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK DEBT SERVICE. There
2 is appropriated from the tax-exempt bond proceeds restricted
3 capital funds account of the tobacco settlement trust fund to
4 the treasurer of state for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
5 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, the following amount, or so
6 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose
7 designated:

8 For debt service for the Iowa communications network,
9 notwithstanding section 12E.12, subsection 1, paragraph "b",
10 subparagraph (1):

12 Funds appropriated in this section shall be deposited in a
13 separate fund established in the office of the treasurer of
14 state to be used solely for debt service for the Iowa
15 communications network. The Iowa telecommunications and
16 technology commission shall certify to the treasurer of state
17 when a debt service payment is due, and upon receipt of the
18 certification, the treasurer shall make the payment. The

32 CAPITOL COMPLEX PARKING STRUCTURE

33 Sec. 27. NEW SECTION. 18A.8 CAPITOL COMPLEX PARKING
34 STRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND.

35 A capitol complex parking structure revolving fund is

1 created in the state treasury. The capitol complex parking
2 structure revolving fund shall be administered by the
3 department of general services and shall consist of moneys
4 collected by the department as parking fees, moneys
5 appropriated to the fund by the general assembly, and any
6 other moneys obtained or accepted by the department for
7 deposit in the revolving fund. The proceeds of the revolving
8 fund are appropriated to and shall be used by the department
9 for costs associated with the management, operation, and
10 maintenance of the capitol complex parking structure located
11 at the intersection of Pennsylvania and Grand avenues in Des
12 Moines. The department shall submit an annual report not
13 later than January 31 to the members of the general assembly
14 and the legislative fiscal bureau, of the activities funded by
15 and expenditures made from the revolving fund during the
16 preceding fiscal year. Section 8.33 does not apply to any
17 moneys in the revolving fund and, notwithstanding section
18 12C.7, subsection 2, earnings or interest on moneys deposited
19 in the revolving fund shall be credited to the revolving fund.

20 Sec. 28. CAPITOL COMPLEX PARKING STRUCTURE MANAGEMENT --
21 REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS. The department of general services, or
22 any successor agency, shall issue a request for proposals for
23 the management, operation, and maintenance of the state-owned
24 parking structure located at the intersection of Pennsylvania
25 and Grand avenues in Des Moines. The request for proposals
26 shall include all of the following services:

27 1. The collection of parking fees and administration of
28 parking permits.

29 2. Daily janitorial maintenance and necessary annual
30 maintenance, pursuant to standards outlined in the parking
31 garage maintenance manual published by the parking consultants
32 council of the national parking association.

33 3. Long-term structural maintenance.

34 Awarding of a contract for the management, operation, and
35 maintenance of the parking structure is subject to approval by

1 the general assembly.

2 Sec. 29. CAPITOL COMPLEX PARKING STRUCTURE -- PARKING
3 FEES. The department of general services, or any successor
4 agency, shall establish reasonable parking fees for the public
5 and for state employees for the use of the state-owned parking
6 structure located at the intersection of Pennsylvania and
7 Grand avenues in Des Moines. Such fees shall be deposited in
8 the capitol complex parking structure revolving fund created
9 in section 18A.8, as enacted by this Act.

EXPLANATION

11 This bill makes appropriations for fiscal year 2003-2004
12 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first
13 fund, and the tax-exempt bond proceeds restricted capital
14 funds account of the tobacco settlement trust fund for various
15 capital and other projects. Appropriations from the rebuild
16 Iowa infrastructure fund include projects for the departments
17 of corrections, cultural affairs, economic development,
18 education, general services, information technology, public
19 defense, public safety, and transportation, and the state
20 board of regents and the Iowa telecommunications and
21 technology commission, and to the state board of regents for
22 tuition replacement.

23 The bill also strikes an appropriation in 2002 Iowa Acts,
24 Second Extraordinary Session, chapter 1001, from the rebuild
25 Iowa infrastructure fund to the state board of regents for the
26 fiscal year 2003-2004 for repayment of the bonding authorized
27 in that Act for the phase II construction of the engineering
28 teaching and research complex at Iowa state university of
29 science and technology. This provision is effective upon
30 enactment.

31 The bill amends an FY 2000-2001 appropriation from the
32 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the judicial branch for
33 construction of the judicial building to allow up to \$400,000
34 to be used for costs associated with operation of the
35 building.

1 The bill appropriates funds from the environment first fund
2 to the departments of agriculture and land stewardship,
3 economic development, and natural resources. The bill
4 appropriates \$11 million from the environment first fund to
5 the resources enhancement and protection fund in lieu of the
6 \$20 million appropriated by statute from the general fund of
7 the state.

8 The bill makes appropriations from the tax-exempt bond
9 proceeds restricted capital funds account of the tobacco
10 settlement trust fund for projects for the departments of
11 corrections, economic development, education, general
12 services, information technology, natural resources, public
13 defense, public safety, and transportation, and for the Iowa
14 state fair authority and the office of treasurer of state.

15 The bill also appropriates funds from the tax-exempt bond
16 proceeds restricted capital funds account of the tobacco
17 settlement trust fund to the state board of regents for
18 tuition replacement and to the treasurer of state for tobacco
19 master settlement agreement litigation fees, debt service for
20 the Iowa communications network, and repayment of prison
21 infrastructure bonds.

22 The bill creates a capitol complex parking structure
23 revolving fund to be administered by the department of general
24 services. The fund is to consist of moneys collected by the
25 department as parking fees, which are to be established by the
26 department for public and state employee use of the parking
27 structure, in addition to any moneys appropriated to the fund
28 by the general assembly and any other moneys obtained for
29 deposit in the fund. The moneys in the fund are appropriated
30 to the department for costs associated with the management,
31 operation, and maintenance of the parking structure. The
32 department is to submit an annual report to the general
33 assembly and the legislative fiscal bureau of the activities
34 funded by and expenditures made from the revolving fund during
35 the preceding fiscal year.

1 In addition, the bill directs the department of general
2 services to issue a request for proposals for the management,
3 operation, and maintenance of the state-owned parking
4 structure. The request for proposals is to include the
5 collection of parking fees and administration of parking
6 permits, daily janitorial maintenance and necessary annual
7 maintenance, and long-term structural maintenance. The bill
8 provides that the awarding of a contract for the services is
9 subject to approval by the general assembly.

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
