Mission Control in Houston, Texas, lost contact with
the shuttle and soon learned that both Columbia and
ts brave crew of seven were lost; and

5 WHEREAS, one of these seven courageous astronauts, 6 Commander Laurel Clark, was born in Ames, Iowa, and 7 lived there for two years while her father studied at 8 Iowa State University of Science and Technology; and 9 WHEREAS, the loss of these daring individuals, who 10 despite the dangers of travel by rocket and the 11 difficulties of navigating in earth's outer atmosphere 12 risked their lives in the hope that their efforts 13 would contribute to greater good for humankind, is a 14 tragedy for Iowa, the nation, and the international 15 community; NOW THEREFORE,

16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, 17 That the House of Representatives joins with the rest 18 of the nation in grieving for and conveying respect 19 and gratitude for the contributions made by Colonel 20 Rick Husband, Lieutenant Michael Anderson, Commander 21 Laurel Clark, Captain Dave Brown, Commander William 22 McCool, Dr. Kalpana Chawla, and Colonel Ilan Ramon. 23
