OLSON, LYKAM, and 10 FALLON 11 A Resolution requesting Iowa's congressional delegation to work to secure adequate funding for 12 mandates required under the federal "No Child Left 13 14 Behind Act of 2001". WHEREAS, President George W. Bush signed into law 15 16 the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) on January 17 8, 2002; and WHEREAS, the goals of the NCLB legislation are 18 19 laudable and Iowans embrace the conviction that all 20 children should have an equal opportunity to obtain a 21 high-quality education; and 22 WHEREAS, Iowa's commitment to providing all of its 23 children with a high-quality education is evidenced by 24 the fact that nearly 90 percent of Iowa's schools 25 score above the national median on nationally 26 standardized tests; and WHEREAS, this commitment begins at the local level 27 28 with school districts and schools setting challenging

30 state's dedication to assisting local schools through

29 local academic standards and continues with the

- 1 the Iowa Early Intervention Program enacted in 1999
- 2 and the Student Achievement and Teacher Quality
- 3 Program enacted in 2001, which continue to provide
- 4 valuable support to school districts and schools
- 5 today; and
- 6 WHEREAS, federal funding for the NCLB represents
- 7 approximately 3.6 percent of Iowa's total school
- 8 district funding for education utilized in a school
- 9 year; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the federal government has neglected to
- 11 provide funding for the NCLB's mandated requirements
- 12 related to supplementary services, transportation
- 13 costs associated with moving students from buildings
- 14 in need of assistance to buildings making annual
- 15 progress, additional data collection, and professional
- 16 development for teachers in schools determined to be
- 17 in need of assistance; and
- 18 WHEREAS, state budget gaps have grown by 50 percent
- 19 this winter and state policymakers will need to
- 20 resolve unprecedented budget shortfalls, according to
- 21 a report released February 4, 2003, by the National
- 22 Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL); and
- 23 WHEREAS, the latest NCSL survey reports that two-
- 24 thirds of the states must reduce their budgets by
- 25 nearly \$26 billion between February 2003 and June 30,
- 26 2003, and states addressed a \$49.1 billion shortfall
- 27 in budgeting for FY 2003; and
- 28 WHEREAS, according to NCSL, state legislatures face
- 29 a minimum \$68.5 billion budget shortfall for FY 2004;
- 30 and

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      WHEREAS, Iowa's economy is not growing enough to
 2 generate adequate funding to improve our education
 3 system and the NCLB requirements create not only
 4 another level of mandates lacking the resources to
 5 bring about the level of success required, but could
 6 actually result in a shift of vital instructional
 7 dollars for NCLB purposes that are unlikely to enhance
 8 student achievement or teacher quality; NOW THEREFORE,
      BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,
10 That the Iowa House of Representatives requests Iowa's
11 elected representatives in the United States Congress,
12 in particular Senator Chuck Grassley, Chair of the
13 Committee on Finance, and Representative Jim Nussle,
14 Chair of the House Budget Committee, to support, work
15 to pass, and vote for adequate funding for mandates
16 required under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.
