1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321J.2C PERSONS FOUND NOT
2 GUILTY.

3 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter to 4 the contrary, if any prosecution for a violation of section 5 321J.2 or 321J.2A does not result in a conviction, and the 6 person's driver's license or nonresident operating privilege 7 has been revoked under section 321J.12 for the occurrence from 8 which the arrest arose, the department shall, upon receipt of 9 the court order finding the person not guilty, immediately 10 rescind the revocation order and reinstate the person's 11 license or nonresident operating privilege.

12 2. Notwithstanding section 321.12 or any other provision 13 of chapter 321 or 321J to the contrary, the director shall 14 immediately destroy any operating records pertaining to a 15 revocation under section 321J.12 for the occurrence from which 16 an arrest arose when the person was subsequently prosecuted 17 and found not guilty upon receipt of the court order finding 18 the person not guilty.

## EXPLANATION

This bill relates to reinstatement of a person's driver's license or nonresident operating privilege following a prosecution for an operating-while-intoxicated offense which does not result in a conviction.

The bill provides that in any prosecution for an operatingwhile-intoxicated offense that does not result in a conviction where the person's driver's license or nonresident operating privilege was revoked, the department of transportation shall, upon receipt of the court order finding the person not guilty, mmediately rescind the revocation order and reinstate the person's driver's license or nonresident operating privilege. The bill further directs the director of the department of transportation to immediately destroy any operating records pertaining to the person's driver's license or nonresident operating privilege revocation.
