- 1 Section 1. Section 153.39, subsection 2, Code 2003, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. A person shall be registered upon the successful
- 4 completion of education and-examination requirements, and
- 5 certification by the person's supervising dentist that the
- 6 candidate is competent to act as a dental assistant.
- 7 Education requirements shall be determined by the board by
- 8 rule, and may be satisfied either through a formal series of
- 9 classes or through job equivalency training, according to
- 10 standards to be determined by the board. The education
- ll requirements may include possession of a valid certificate in
- 12 a nationally recognized course in cardiopulmonary
- 13 resuscitation. Successful-passage-of-an-examination
- 14 administered-by-the-board,-which-shall-include-sections
- 15 Standards for certification that the candidate is competent
- 16 shall be determined by the board by rule, and may include
- 17 areas regarding infection control, hazardous materials, and
- 18 jurisprudence,-shall-also-be-required. The board shall
- 19 establish continuing education requirements as a condition of
- 20 renewing registration as a registered dental assistant, as
- 21 well as standards for the suspension or revocation of
- 22 registration.
- 23 EXPLANATION
- 24 This bill provides for the elimination of an examination
- 25 requirement as a prerequisite for being designated a
- 26 registered dental assistant. The bill provides that in lieu
- 27 of the examination requirement, a candidate for registration
- 28 shall obtain a certification of competency from the
- 29 supervising dentist. The bill provides that standards for
- 30 certification that the candidate is competent shall be
- 31 determined by the board by rule, and may include areas
- 32 regarding infection control, hazardous materials, and
- 33 jurisprudence.

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
