1 Section 1. Section 321.285, subsections 4 through 6, Code
2 2003, are amended to read as follows:

3 4. Notwithstanding any other speed restrictions, the speed
4 limit for all vehicular traffic shall-be-fifty-five is sixty
5 miles per hour.

6 5. Reasonable and proper, but not greater than fifty-five 7 miles per hour at any time between sunrise and sunset, and not 8 greater than fifty miles per hour at any time between sunset 9 and sunrise, on secondary roads unless. However, if such 10 roads are surfaced with concrete or asphalt or a combination 11 of both, in-which-case the speed limits-shall-be-the-same-as 12 provided-in-subsection-4-of-this-section limit is fifty-five 13 miles per hour at all times of day. When the board of 14 supervisors of any county shall determine upon the basis of an 15 engineering and traffic investigation that the speed limit on 16 any secondary road is greater than is reasonable and proper 17 under the conditions found to exist at any intersection or 18 other place or upon any part of a secondary road, the board 19 shall determine and declare a reasonable and proper speed 20 limit at the intersection or other part of the secondary road. 21 The speed limits as determined by the board of supervisors 22 shall be effective when appropriate signs giving notice of the 23 speed limits are erected by the board of supervisors at the 24 intersection or other place or part of the highway.

6. <u>a.</u> Notwithstanding any other speed restrictions, the speed limit for all vehicular traffic on fully controlledaccess, divided, multilaned highways including the national system of interstate highways is <u>sixty-five</u> <u>seventy</u> miles per hour. The department may establish a speed limit of <u>sixty-</u> <u>ofive</u> <u>seventy</u> miles per hour on certain divided, multilaned highways. However, the department, or <u>cities a city</u> with the approval of the department, may establish a lower speed limit upon on such highways located within the corporate limits of a city. For the purposes of this subsection, a fully controlled-access highway is a highway that gives preference

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1 to through traffic by providing access connections with 2 selected public roads only and by prohibiting crossings at 3 grade or direct private driveway connections. b. A minimum speed may be established by the department on 4 5 the highways referred to in this subsection if warranted by 6 engineering and traffic investigations. c. It-is-further-provided-that-any Any kind of vehicle, 7 8 implement, or conveyance incapable of attaining and 9 maintaining a speed of forty miles per hour shall be 10 prohibited from using the interstate road system. 11 EXPLANATION 12 This bill increases the speed limit for all vehicles on 13 fully controlled-access, divided, multilaned highways, 14 including interstates, from 65 to 70 miles per hour. The 15 state department of transportation may establish a 70-mile-16 per-hour speed limit on other divided, multilaned highways. 17 The department and cities retain the authority to lower the 18 speed limit within the corporate limits of a city. The bill also increases the speed limit on primary highways 19 20 from 55 to 60 miles per hour. Current scheduled fines for 21 speeding violations under Code section 805.8A are applicable 22 to violations of the new speed limits. 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33

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
