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This bill increases the speed limit for all vehicles on fully controlled-access, divided, multilaned highways, including interstates, from 65 to 70 miles per hour. The state department of transportation may establish a 70-mile-per-hour speed limit on other divided, multilaned highways. The department and cities retain the authority to lower the speed limit within the corporate limits of a city.

The bill also increases the speed limit on primary highways from 55 to 60 miles per hour. Current scheduled fines for speeding violations under Code section 805.8A are applicable to violations of the new speed limits.
