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- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 256.24 SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE
- 2 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
- 3 l. The department shall establish a school infrastructure
- 4 assistance program. The purpose of the program shall be to
- 5 provide financial assistance to school districts facing school
- 6 infrastructure needs which are determined to fall below the
- 7 median property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil for the
- 8 state. For the purposes of this section, "school
- 9 infrastructure" means activities initiated on or after July 1,
- 10 2003, as authorized in section 296.1 but does not include
- 11 those activities related to stadiums, bus barns, a home or
- 12 homes of a teacher or superintendent, procuring and improving
- 13 a site for an athletic field, or improving a site already
- 14 owned for an athletic field.
- 15 2. A school district shall be eligible to participate in
- 16 the school infrastructure assistance program if the school
- 17 district has imposed a local sales and services tax for school
- 18 infrastructure pursuant to chapter 422E which is in effect on
- 19 the program application date, and the district's property tax
- 20 infrastructure capacity per pupil, as defined in section
- 21 292.1, falls below the median property tax infrastructure
- 22 capacity per pupil calculated for each school district in the
- 23 state. A school district with a combined tax capacity, as
- 24 determined pursuant to subsection 3, which equals or exceeds
- 25 the median property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil for
- 26 the state shall not be eligible for assistance pursuant to
- 27 this section.
- 28 3. In order to determine the amount of funding an eligible
- 29 school district may receive, the department shall determine a
- 30 combined tax capacity for each school district in the state.
- 31 The combined tax capacity shall equal the district's property
- 32 tax infrastructure capacity per pupil plus the per pupil
- 33 amount generated in the district by the local sales and
- 34 services tax for school infrastructure. An eligible school
- 35 district may receive an amount up to that amount necessary to

- 1 raise the district's combined tax capacity up to the median
- 2 property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil for the state.
- 3 4. A school district wishing to participate in the school
- 4 infrastructure assistance program shall submit an application
- 5 to the department on a form developed by the department by
- 6 October 15 annually. In the event that the amount
- 7 appropriated annually to fund the program pursuant to section
- 8 256.25 is insufficient to raise all eligible applicant school
- 9 districts up to the median property tax infrastructure
- 10 capacity for the state, the department shall prorate
- 11 allocations from the fund to all eligible applicant school
- 12 districts.
- 13 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 256.25 SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE
- 14 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM -- APPROPRIATION.
- 15 Each school district whose combined tax capacity, as
- 16 determined pursuant to section 256.24, subsection 3, exceeds
- 17 the median property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil for
- 18 the state shall be identified.
- 19 For each school district identified, an amount shall be
- 20 subtracted from the amount which would otherwise be paid to
- 21 the school district pursuant to section 257.16. The amount
- 22 subtracted shall correspond to the proportion by which the
- 23 amount of the excess for the school district bears to the
- 24 total amount of the excess for all school districts in the
- 25 state which exceed the median property tax infrastructure
- 26 capacity per pupil, which total amount is necessary to provide
- 27 funding to bring all school districts up to the median
- 28 property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil for the state.
- 29 The amounts subtracted for each school district exceeding
- 30 the median property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil are
- 31 appropriated to the department for allocation to those school
- 32 districts participating in the school infrastructure
- 33 assistance program pursuant to section 256.24.
- 34 EXPLANATION
- 35 This bill provides for the creation of a school

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- 1 infrastructure assistance program to be administered by the
- 2 department of education. The bill provides that the purpose
- 3 of the program shall be to supply financial assistance to
- 4 school districts facing school infrastructure needs which are
- 5 determined to fall below the median property tax
- 6 infrastructure capacity per pupil for the state. The bill
- 7 references Code section 296.1 regarding a definition of
- 8 "school infrastructure" for activities initiated on or after
- 9 July 1, 2003, but provides that school infrastructure shall
- 10 not include activities related to stadiums, bus barns, a home
- 11 or homes of a teacher or superintendent, procuring and
- 12 improving a site for an athletic field, or improving a site
- 13 already owned for an athletic field.
- 14 The bill provides that a school district shall be eligible
- 15 to participate in the school infrastructure assistance program
- 16 if the district has imposed a local sales and services tax for
- 17 school infrastructure which is in effect on the program
- 18 application date, and if the district's property tax
- 19 infrastructure capacity per pupil, as determined pursuant to
- 20 Code section 292.1, subsection 7, falls below the median
- 21 property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil calculated for
- 22 all school districts in the state. Code section 292.1,
- 23 subsection 7, provides that a school district's property tax
- 24 infrastructure capacity per pupil equals the sum of a school
- 25 district's levies under Code sections 298.2 and 298.18 if
- 26 imposed to the maximum extent permissible in a school budget
- 27 year, divided by a school district's basic enrollment for the
- 28 budget year.
- 29 The bill provides that to determine the amount of funding
- 30 which an eligible school district may receive, the department
- 31 shall determine a combined tax capacity for each school
- 32 district in the state. The bill provides that the combined
- 33 tax capacity shall equal a district's property tax
- 34 infrastructure capacity per pupil plus the per pupil amount
- 35 generated in the district by the local sales and services tax

1 for school infrastructure. The bill provides that an eligible 2 school district may receive an amount up to that necessary to 3 raise the district's combined tax capacity up to the median 4 property tax infrastructure capacity per pupil for the state. The bill provides that a school district wishing to 6 participate in the school infrastructure assistance program 7 shall submit an application to the department on a form 8 developed by the department by October 15 annually, and 9 provides for proration of amounts appropriated for the program 10 in the event such amounts are insufficient to fully fund 11 allocations to all eligible applicant school districts. 12 bill further provides that a school district with a combined 13 tax capacity which equals or exceeds the median property tax 14 infrastructure capacity per pupil for the state shall not be 15 eligible for assistance pursuant to the program. 16 The bill provides an annual appropriation to fund the 17 program from the general fund of the state to the department 18 of education corresponding to a proportionate reduction in 19 state aid otherwise payable to school districts having imposed 20 the local sales and services tax for school infrastructure 21 with a combined tax capacity exceeding the median property tax 22 infrastructure capacity per pupil for the state. 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34

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
