## A BILL FOR

1 An Act establishing a surcharge for certain speeding violations,
2 creating a speeding violation surcharge fund, and making an
3 appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

## s.f. 2079 H.f.

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 80.41 SPEEDING VIOLATION 2 SURCHARGE FUND.
- 3 l. A speeding violation surcharge fund is created in the
- 4 state treasury under the control of the department of public
- 5 safety. The fund shall consist of moneys collected from the
- 6 speeding violation surcharge under section 911.4 and credited
- 7 to the fund pursuant to this section. Section 8.33 does not
- 8 apply to moneys in the fund and, notwithstanding section
- 9 12C.7, subsection 2, earnings or interest on moneys deposited
- 10 in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Moneys in the fund
- 11 are appropriated to the department of public safety to be used
- 12 for the purposes and programs under the authority of the
- 13 department.
- 2. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and for
- 15 subsequent fiscal years, the director of transportation shall
- 16 submit an annual statement to the treasurer of state of the
- 17 average number of convictions reported annually pursuant to
- 18 section 321.491 for the previous five calendar years for
- 19 speeding violations punishable under section 805.8A,
- 20 subsection 5, paragraph "a", subparagraphs (3) through (5),
- 21 and section 805.8A, subsection 5, paragraph "b", subparagraphs
- 22 (3) through (5). All moneys collected from the speeding
- 23 violation surcharge under section 911.4 and deposited in the
- 24 general fund shall be credited to the speeding violation
- 25 surcharge fund, except that the amount credited for a fiscal
- 26 year shall not exceed the sum of revenues that would derive
- 27 from the application of the surcharge to the annual average
- 28 number of convictions for the preceding five calendar years as
- 29 determined under this subsection. Any revenues collected from
- 30 the speeding violation surcharge in excess of the amount
- 31 appropriated for a fiscal year pursuant to this section shall
- 32 be retained in the general fund of the state.
- 33 Sec. 2. Section 602.8102, Code Supplement 2003, is amended
- 34 by adding the following new subsection:
- 35 NEW SUBSECTION. 135C. Assess the speeding violation

- 1 surcharge as provided by section 911.4.
- 2 Sec. 3. Section 602.8107, subsection 4, unnumbered
- 3 paragraph 2, Code Supplement 2003, is amended to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 This subsection does not apply to amounts collected for
- 6 victim restitution, the victim compensation fund, criminal
- 7 penalty surcharge, law enforcement initiative surcharge,
- 8 speeding violation surcharge, amounts collected as a result of
- 9 procedures initiated under subsection 5 or under section
- 10 8A.504, or sheriff's room and board fees.
- 11 Sec. 4. Section 602.8108, subsection 4, Code Supplement
- 12 2003, is amended to read as follow:
- 13 4. When a court assesses the law enforcement initiative
- 14 surcharge under section 911.3, or the speeding violation
- 15 surcharge under section 911.4, the clerk of court shall remit
- 16 to the treasurer of the state, no later than the fifteenth day
- 17 of each month, all the moneys collected during the preceding
- 18 month, for deposit in the general fund of the state.
- 19 Sec. 5. Section 805.8A, subsection 5, Code Supplement
- 20 2003, is amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 21 NEW PARAGRAPH. bb. In addition to the criminal penalty
- 22 surcharge assessed pursuant to chapter 911, the speeding
- 23 violation surcharge specified in section 911.4 shall be added
- 24 to the scheduled fines in paragraph "a", subparagraphs (3)
- 25 through (5), and paragraph "b", subparagraphs (3) through (5).
- Sec. 6. Section 909.8, Code 2003, is amended to read as
- 27 follows:
- 28 909.8 PAYMENT AND COLLECTION PROVISIONS APPLY TO
- 29 SURCHARGE.
- 30 The provisions of this chapter governing the payment and
- 31 collection of a fine, except section 909.3A, also apply to the
- 32 payment and collection of surcharges imposed pursuant to
- 33 chapter 911. However, section 909.10 shall not apply to
- 34 surcharges assessed under section sections 911.3 and 911.4.
- 35 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 911.4 SPEEDING VIOLATION SURCHARGE.

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- 1 l. In addition to the criminal penalty surcharge assessed
- 2 pursuant to this chapter, a speeding violation surcharge shall
- 3 be assessed by the clerk of the district court as follows when
- 4 the court imposes a fine for a scheduled violation under any
- 5 of the following provisions:
- 6 a. For a violation for speeding more than ten but not more
- 7 than fifteen miles per hour over the speed limit under section
- 8 805.8A, subsection 5, paragraph "a", subparagraph (3), or
- 9 section 805.8A, subsection 5, paragraph "b", subparagraph (3),
- 10 the surcharge is fifty dollars.
- ll b. For a violation for speeding more than fifteen but not
- 12 more than twenty miles per hour over the speed limit under
- 13 section 805.8A, subsection 5, paragraph "a", subparagraph (4),
- 14 or section 805.8A, subsection 5, paragraph "b", subparagraph
- 15 (4), the surcharge is one hundred dollars.
- 16 c. For a violation for speeding more than twenty miles per
- 17 hour over the speed limit under section 805.8A, subsection 5,
- 18 paragraph "a", subparagraph (5), or section 805.8A, subsection
- 19 5, paragraph "b", subparagraph (5), the surcharge is two
- 20 hundred dollars.
- 21 2. The surcharge shall be deposited in the general fund of
- 22 the state and credited to the speeding violation surcharge
- 23 fund pursuant to section 80.41.
- 24 3. The surcharge is subject to the provisions of chapter
- 25 909 governing the payment and collection of fines, as provided
- 26 in section 909.8.
- 27 EXPLANATION
- 28 This bill creates a speeding violation surcharge for
- 29 excessive speed violations committed by speeding 10 miles per
- 30 hour or more over the speed limit. For speeding violations
- 31 more than 10 but not more than 15 miles per hour over the
- 32 speed limit, the surcharge is \$50. For speeding violations
- 33 more than 15 but not more than 20 miles per hour over the
- 34 speed limit, the surcharge is \$100. For speeding violations
- 35 more than 20 miles per hour over the speed limit, the

1 surcharge is \$200. The surcharge is in addition to scheduled 2 fines and the criminal penalty surcharge currently imposed for 3 such violations. Moneys from the surcharge are to be 4 deposited initially in the general fund of the state. The bill creates a speeding violation surcharge fund and 6 appropriates moneys in the fund to the department of public 7 safety. The fund consists of moneys collected from the 8 speeding violation surcharge and deposited in the general 9 fund, then credited annually to the speeding violation 10 surcharge fund, up to the amount that would derive from 11 application of the surcharge to the average number of 12 convictions reported to the state department of transportation 13 for the last five years for the type of violations subject to 14 the surcharge. Revenues collected from the surcharge which 15 are in excess of the amount appropriated to the department of 16 public safety for a fiscal year are to be retained in the 17 general fund of the state. The bill directs that a clerk of court shall remit all 18 19 moneys collected in the preceding month from the speeding 20 violation surcharge to the treasurer of state for deposit in 21 the general fund. Speeding violation surcharges are exempt 22 from Code provisions allowing a county to retain a portion of 23 delinquent surcharges collected by a county attorney and 24 requiring that delinquent fines collected by the clerk of 25 court be deposited in a judicial revolving fund. 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34

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
