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1 An Act creating a water quality needs and infrastructure program
2 and fund.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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SF 214 NAT. RES. & ENVIRONMENT

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 455B.183D WATER QUALITY NEEDS
- 2 AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM -- FUND.
- 3 1. A water quality needs and infrastructure program shall
- 4 be implemented and administered by the department. The
- 5 program shall provide financial assistance for the
- 6 administration, regulation, and enforcement of the federal
- 7 Safe Drinking Water Act, source water protection grants, and
- 8 infrastructure loans to water systems.
- 9 2. a. A water quality needs and infrastructure fund is
- 10 created in the state treasury under the control of the
- 11 department. Notwithstanding section 423.2, subsection 10,
- 12 revenues received from the taxation of water pursuant to
- 13 section 423.2, subsection 2, shall be deposited in the water
- 14 quality needs and infrastructure fund. Notwithstanding
- 15 section 8.33, moneys in the water quality needs and
- 16 infrastructure fund at the end of each fiscal year shall not
- 17 revert to any other fund but shall remain in the water quality
- 18 needs and infrastructure fund for expenditure for subsequent
- 19 fiscal years. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest or
- 20 earnings on moneys in the water quality needs and
- 21 infrastructure fund shall be credited to the fund.
- 22 b. Within the water quality needs and infrastructure fund,
- 23 the department shall create the following accounts:
- 24 (1) A water quality protection account.
- 25 (2) A drinking water infrastructure revolving loan
- 26 account.
- 27 (3) A source water protection account.
- 28 c. Moneys deposited in the fund pursuant to paragraph "a"
- 29 shall be allocated as follows:
- 30 (1) Ten cents out of each dollar shall be deposited in the
- 31 water quality protection account to be used for purposes of
- 32 enforcing provisions of the federal Safe Drinking Water Act as
- 33 delegated to the state.
- 34 (2) Fifty cents out of each dollar shall be deposited in
- 35 the drinking water infrastructure revolving loan account to be

- 1 used for purposes of providing low-interest loans to public
- 2 water systems and community water systems which can comply
- 3 with or have the potential to comply with the financial,
- 4 technical, and managerial criteria of a viability assessment
- 5 and remain in compliance with requirements of the federal Safe
- 6 Drinking Water Act.
- 7 (3) Forty cents out of each dollar shall be deposited in
- 8 the source water protection account to be used for the purpose
- 9 of building capacity for wellhead and watershed protection
- 10 initiatives.
- 11 Sec. 2. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The department of natural
- 12 resources shall form an advisory committee for purposes of
- 13 assisting in the development of rules to administer this Act.
- 14 The advisory committee shall assist in the development of
- 15 qualification criteria for the approval of programs and
- 16 projects receiving financial assistance under this Act. The
- 17 advisory committee shall consist of representatives from the
- 18 following entities:
- 19 1. The department of natural resources.
- 20 2. The department of agriculture and land stewardship.
- 21 3. Iowa state university of science and technology.
- 22 4. The college of public health at the state university of
- 23 Iowa.
- 5. The Iowa association of municipal utilities.
- 25 6. The Iowa association of water agencies.
- 7. The Iowa section of the American water works
- 27 association.
- 28 8. The Iowa rural water association.
- 29 9. The Iowa water pollution control association.
- 30 10. The Iowa league of cities.
- 31 11. The natural resources conservation service.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 This bill creates a water quality needs and infrastructure
- 34 program and fund.
- 35 The bill provides that a water quality needs and

- 1 infrastructure program shall be implemented and administered
- 2 by the department of natural resources to provide financial
- 3 assistance for the administration, regulation, and enforcement
- 4 of the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, and for source water
- 5 protection grants and infrastructure loans to water systems.
- 6 The bill provides that a water quality needs and
- 7 infrastructure fund is created in the state treasury under the
- 8 control of the department and, within the fund, creates a
- 9 water quality protection account, a drinking water
- 10 infrastructure revolving loan account, and a source water
- ll protection account. The bill provides that revenues from the
- 12 sales tax on the furnishing of water shall be deposited in the
- 13 water quality needs and infrastructure fund instead of the
- 14 general fund of the state.
- 15 The bill provides that 10 cents out of each dollar
- 16 deposited in the fund shall be deposited in the water quality
- 17 protection account to be used for purposes of enforcing
- 18 provisions of the federal Safe Drinking Water Act as delegated
- 19 to the state. The bill provides that 50 cents out of each
- 20 dollar deposited in the fund shall be deposited in the
- 21 drinking water infrastructure revolving loan account to be
- 22 used for purposes of providing low-interest loans to public
- 23 water systems and community water systems which can comply
- 24 with or have the potential to comply with the financial,
- 25 technical, and managerial criteria of a viability assessment
- 26 and remain in compliance with requirements of the federal Safe
- 27 Drinking Water Act. The bill provides that 40 cents out of
- 28 each dollar deposited in the fund shall be deposited in the
- 29 source water protection account to be used for the purpose of
- 30 building capacity for wellhead and watershed protection
- 31 initiatives.
- 32 The bill provides that the department of natural resources
- 33 shall form an advisory committee for purposes of assisting in
- 34 the development of rules to administer the bill. The bill
- 35 provides that the advisory committee shall assist in the

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1 development of qualification criteria for the approval of
 2 programs and projects receiving financial assistance under the
 3 bill.
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
