4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:	
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- Section 1. NEW SECTION. 12.67 LITTERING REWARDS FUND.
- 2 A littering rewards fund is established in the state
- 3 treasury, to be administered by the treasurer of state. The
- 4 fund shall consist of moneys allocated to the fund pursuant to
- 5 section 602.8108, subsection 7. Moneys in the fund shall be
- 6 used to provide rewards to persons who report the crimes of
- 7 littering and placing debris on a public highway or in a state
- 8 park. A reward of one hundred dollars shall be paid from the
- 9 moneys in the fund to any person who provides information to a
- 10 law enforcement agency which subsequently leads to the
- 11 conviction of an offender under section 321.369, 321.370, or
- 12 461A.43. In order to receive the reward, a person who
- 13 provides information which leads to the conviction of an
- 14 offender under section 321.369, 321.370, or 461A.43 shall
- 15 provide the treasurer of state a certified document from the
- 16 law enforcement agency stating the person provided information
- 17 which led to the conviction and a certified copy of the court
- 18 order relating to the offender's conviction.
- 19 Sec. 2. Section 602.8108, subsection 2, Code Supplement
- 20 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 2. Except as otherwise provided, the clerk of the district
- 22 court shall report and submit to the state court
- 23 administrator, not later than the fifteenth day of each month,
- 24 the fines and fees received during the preceding calendar
- 25 month. Except as provided in subsections 4, and 5, and 7, the
- 26 state court administrator shall deposit the amounts received
- 27 with the treasurer of state for deposit in the general fund of
- 28 the state. The state court administrator shall report to the
- 29 legislative services agency within thirty days of the
- 30 beginning of each fiscal quarter the amount received during
- 31 the previous quarter in the account established under this
- 32 section.
- 33 Sec. 3. Section 602.8108, Code Supplement 2003, is amended
- 34 by adding the following new subsection:
- 35 NEW SUBSECTION. 7. The state court administrator shall

- 1 allocate twenty-five percent of all of the fines attributable
- 2 to littering citations issued pursuant to sections 321.369,
- 3 321.370, and 461A.43 to the treasurer of state for deposit in
- 4 the littering rewards fund established in section 12.67.
- 5 Sec. 4. Section 805.8A, subsection 14, paragraph d, Code
- 6 Supplement 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 d. LITTER AND DEBRIS VIOLATIONS. For violations under
- 8 sections 321.369 and 321.370, the scheduled fine is thirty-
- 9 five five hundred dollars.
- 10 Sec. 5. Section 805.8B, subsection 6, paragraph b, Code
- 11 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- b. For violations under sections 461A.40, 46±A.437
- 13 461A.46, and 461A.49, the scheduled fine is fifteen dollars.
- 14 Sec. 6. Section 805.8B, subsection 6, Code 2003, is
- 15 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- NEW PARAGRAPH. e. For violations under section 461A.43,
- 17 the scheduled fine is five hundred dollars.
- 18 EXPLANATION
- 19 This bill relates to littering or placing debris on a
- 20 public highway or state parkland and establishes a fund.
- 21 The bill raises the scheduled fine for littering or placing
- 22 debris on a public highway from \$35 to \$500. The bill also
- 23 raises the scheduled fine for littering in a state park from
- 24 \$15 to \$500.
- 25 The bill provides that 25 percent of all fines attributable
- 26 to littering or placing debris citations issued pursuant to
- 27 Code sections 321.369, 321.370, and 461A.43 shall be deposited
- 28 in the littering rewards fund established in the office of the
- 29 state treasurer. A person who reports littering or placing
- 30 debris on a public highway or in a state park which
- 31 subsequently leads to the conviction of an offender under Code
- 32 section 321.369, 321.370, or 461A.43 shall receive a reward of
- 33 \$100 from the moneys in the fund. In order to receive the
- 34 reward, a person who provides information which leads to the
- 35 conviction of an offender under Code section 321.369, 321.370,

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1 or 461A.43 shall provide the treasurer of state a certified 2 document from the law enforcement agency stating the person 3 provided information which led to the conviction and a 4 certified copy of the court order relating to the offender's 5 conviction.
