

## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to civil damages recoverable against a person who 2 sends certain electronic mail transmissions.

Section 1. Section 7l4E.l, subsection 3, paragraph a, subparagraph (2), Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:
(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph (1), a person who transmits or causes to be transmitted electronic mail in violation of subsection 2 is liable to the recipient of the electronic mail for monetary damages in an amount equal to any actual damages, including lost profits, caused by such transmittal. The recipient, in lieu of actual damages, may elect to recover from the person transmitting or causing to be transmitted such electronic mail the greater of ten dollars for each bulk electronic mail message transmitted to the recipient in violation of this section, or five-hundred one thousand dollars. In addition to the monetary damages, the recipient is also entitled to costs and reasonable attorney fees.

## EXPLANATION

This bill relates to civil damages recoverable against a person who sends certain electronic mail transmissions, commonly referred to as E-mail.

Under the bill, a person who sends bulk electronic mail in violation of Code chapter 7l4E.l, subsection 2 , is liable to the recipient in the amount of $\$ 10$ for each bulk electronic mail message sent or $\$ 1,000$, whichever is greater. Current law provides that a person sending the bulk electronic mail transmission is liable in the amount of $\$ 10$ for each bulk electronic transmission sent to the recipient or $\$ 500$, whichever is greater.
