- 1 Section 1. Section 231.23A, Code Supplement 2003, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 6A. Programs transferred in accordance
- 4 with section 231.25.
- 5 Sec. 2 NEW SECTION. 231.25 CONSOLIDATION OF PROGRAMS FOR
- 6 THE ELDERLY.
- 7 The departments and agencies listed in this section shall
- 8 enter into a chapter 28E agreement with the department of
- 9 elder affairs to transfer to the department of elder affairs
- 10 the administration of the programs referenced in this section
- 11 and other programs serving elderly persons. The chapter 28E
- 12 agreement shall also provide for transfer of the funding
- 13 associated with a transferred program. A program shall be
- 14 exempted from transfer under this section if transfer of the
- 15 program is prohibited by federal law, expressly prohibited by
- 16 state law, or the department of elder affairs determines that
- 17 transfer of the program would be impractical or not beneficial
- 18 to elderly persons. The transfer of the program
- 19 administration shall be completed during the fiscal year
- 20 beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005. The
- 21 departments to which this section is applicable and programs
- 22 that may be subject to transfer shall include all of the
- 23 following:
- 24 1. Department of human services programs, including but
- 25 not limited to the following:
- 26 a. Medical assistance services such as nursing facility
- 27 care, assisted living, elderly waiver and other applicable
- 28 home and community-based waiver services, and other community-
- 29 based services directed primarily toward the elderly.
- 30 b. Dependent adult abuse.
- 31 2. Iowa department of public health programs, including
- 32 but not limited to home care aide and chore services.
- 33 3. Other state departments and agencies that administer a
- 34 program identified by the department of elder affairs as
- 35 serving the elderly.

1 **EXPLANATION** 2 This bill provides for transfer of administration of 3 programs for the elderly to the department of elder affairs. 4 The term "elderly" is defined in Code chapter 231 to mean 5 individuals who are 60 years of age or older. The bill requires state departments to enter into a Code 7 chapter 28E agreement with the department of elder affairs to 8 transfer administration and the associated funding of programs 9 that are directed to elderly persons. Code chapter 28E 10 provides a mechanism for joint exercise of public agency 11 powers, privileges, or authority. A program shall be exempted 12 from the transfer if the transfer is prohibited by federal 13 law, expressly prohibited by state law, or the department 14 determines that the transfer of the program would be 15 impractical or not beneficial to elderly persons. The bill 16 lists certain programs administered by the departments of 17 human services and public health as possibilities for 18 transfer.
