EXPLANATION

16 This bill gives the department of public health discretion 17 to provide financial assistance to local governments in the 18 event of a public health emergency or disaster. In the event 19 the department does not have sufficient unencumbered funds, 20 the governor may, by executive order, commit funds from the 21 general fund for the emergency or disaster.
