A BILL FOR 1 An Act creating a forgivable loan program under the college student aid commission for certain persons who were placed in foster care or another out-of-home placement. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 261.112 FOSTERING ACHIEVEMENT 2 FORGIVABLE LOAN PROGRAM.
- 3 1. A fostering achievement forgivable loan program is
- 4 established to be administered by the college student aid
- 5 commission for eligible persons. For purposes of this
- 6 section, unless the context otherwise requires, "eligible
- 7 person" means a person who meets both of the following
- 8 conditions:
- 9 a. The person was subject to a court order under chapter
- 10 232, division III or IV, which transferred the custody of the
- 11 person to the department of human services and the person was
- 12 in a foster care placement or another out-of-home placement
- 13 for a period of six months or longer any of the following
- 14 times in the person's life:
- 15 (1) The day of the person's eighteenth birthday.
- 16 (2) The day of the person's fourteenth birthday, if the
- 17 person was eligible for adoption on or after that date.
- 18 (3) The day on which the person graduated from high school
- 19 or received the equivalent of a high school diploma.
- 20 b. The person enrolls in an undergraduate course of study
- 21 at a community college as defined in section 260C.2, an
- 22 institution of higher learning under the control of the state
- 23 board of regents, or an accredited private institution as
- 24 defined in section 261.9 on or before the third anniversary of
- 25 the date the person was discharged from foster care, graduated
- 26 from high school, or received the equivalent of a high school
- 27 diploma.
- 28 2. The amount of a fostering achievement forgivable loan
- 29 shall not exceed the resident tuition rate established for
- 30 institutions of higher learning under the control of the state
- 31 board of regents.
- 32 3. Forgivable loans to eligible persons shall not become
- 33 due until after the eligible person graduates or leaves
- 34 school. Interest on the loans shall begin to accrue the day
- 35 following the person's graduation date. If the person remains

1 a resident of the state and is employed in the state, the

- 2 person's total loan amount, including principal and interest,
- 3 shall be reduced by twenty-five percent for each year in which
- 4 the person remains an Iowa resident and is employed in Iowa.
- 5 If the commission determines that the person does not meet the
- 6 criteria for forgiveness of the principal and interest
- 7 payments, the commission shall establish a plan for repayment
- 8 of the principal and interest. If the person required to make
- 9 repayment fails to make the required payments, the commission
- 10 shall provide for payment collection.
- 11 4. A fostering achievement forgivable loan revolving fund
- 12 is created in the state treasury as a separate fund under the
- 13 control of the commission. The commission shall deposit
- 14 payments made by fostering achievement forgivable loan
- 15 recipients and the proceeds from the sale of fostering
- 16 achievement forgivable loans into the fostering achievement
- 17 forgivable loan revolving fund. Moneys credited to the fund
- 18 shall be used to supplement moneys appropriated for the
- 19 fostering achievement forgivable loan program.
- 20 Notwithstanding section 8.33, any balance in the fund on June
- 21 30 of any fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund of
- 22 the state.
- 23 5. The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 24 17A to administer this section.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- 26 This bill establishes a fostering achievement forgivable
- 27 loan program for persons who were placed in foster care or
- 28 another out-of-home placement.
- 29 Under the program, which is administered by the college
- 30 student aid commission, persons who were in the custody of the
- 31 department of human services under a child in need of
- 32 assistance or termination of parental rights court order and
- 33 in foster care placement for a period of six months or longer
- 34 the day prior to their eighteenth birthday, the day of their
- 35 fourteenth birthday if eligible for adoption, or the day of

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1 high school graduation or the receipt of an equivalency
 2 diploma, are eligible for the program. The eligible person
 3 must enroll in an undergraduate course of study at a community
 4 college, regents university, or accredited private
 5 postsecondary institution in Iowa and the amount of the loan
 6 shall not exceed the resident tuition rate established for
 7 regents universities.
      Forgivable loans become due after the person graduates or
 9 leaves school. Upon graduation, the person's total loan
10 amount, including principal and interest, is reduced by 25
11 percent for each year in which the person remains an Iowa
12 resident and is employed in Iowa. If the person fails to meet
13 the loan criteria, the commission is directed to establish a
14 plan for repayment of the principal and interest and to
15 provide for debt collection if the person fails to make the
16 required payments.
      The bill creates a fostering achievement forgivable loan
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18 revolving fund in the state treasury for the deposit of such
19 payments. Moneys in the fund are to be used to supplement
20 moneys in the program.
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
