The specifications, tolerances, or other technical 14 15 requirements as adopted in handbook 44 or by rule that apply 16 to the commercial weighing and measuring device on the date 17 that the commercial weighing and measuring device is installed 18 shall continue to apply to that commercial weighing and 19 measuring device.
