## A BILL FOR

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

An Act relating to the regulation of vessels by increasing certain vessel registration fees, increasing the registration period of vessels to three years, regulating the operation of certain vessels by minors, providing for increased inspections of certain vessels, providing for pilot and engineer licensing fees, and appropriating the moneys collected to the state fish and game protection fund.

Section 1. Section 462A.5, subsection 1 , unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:

The owner of each vessel required to be numbered by this state shall register it every two three years with the county recorder of the county in which the owner resides, or, if the owner is a nonresident, the owner shall register it in the county in which such vessel is principally used. The commission shall have supervisory responsibility over the registration of all vessels and shall provide each county recorder with registration forms and certificates and shall allocate identification numbers to each county.

Sec. 2. Section 462A.5, subsection 3, Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:
3. The registration fees for vessels subject to this chapter are as follows:
a. For vessels of any length without motor or sail, fize eight dollars.
b. For motorboats or sailboats less than twełve sixteen feet in length, eight fifteen dollars.
c. For motorboats or sailboats twełve sixteen feet or more, but less than fifteen twenty-six feet in length, ten twenty-five dollars.

Private vessels may also be inspected to determine their seaworthiness at any time by representatives of the commission or by any peace officer who is trained in enforcing, and who in the regular course of duty enforces, boating and navigation laws.

Sec. 6. Section 462A.22, Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:

462A. 22 ENGINEER OR PILOT LICENSE AND FEES.

1. No A vessel shall not be operated for hire by a pilot or engineer upon the waters of this state under the jurisdiction of the commission unless the pilot or engineer first obtains an engineer's or pilot's license. A pilot's license is required for any person who has charge of the steering or directing of the vessel's course or who does the steering or directs the vessel's course. An engineer's license is required for all operators who have charge of or operate the equipment by which the boat is propelled. If one person acts in a dual or alternate capacity, the person shall
34 first obtain both an engineer's and pilot's license.
2. Any person desiring a pilot's or engineer's license

shall file an application with the commission upon forms prepared and furnished by the commission. Such license may be issued by the commission only upon recommendation of an officer duly authorized by the commission. An officer may board a vessel in the course of an inspection if the operator is unable to supply visual evidence that the vessel is properly registered and equipped as required by this chapter and rules of the 10 commission. The inspection shall not include an inspection of 11 an area that is not essential to determine compliance with the 12 provisions of this chapter and rules of the commission. 13 Sec. 10. Section 462A.21, Code 2003, is repealed.

The bill provides that every registration on April 30 of the last calendar year of the registration period and that if an application for the three-year registration period is not made before May $l$ of the last calendar year of the registration period, the applicant shall be charged a penalty of $\$ 5$. The bill also provides that an unregistered vessel that is registered after January 1 of the year succeeding the beginning of the three-year registration period may be registered for the remainder of the current registration period at a prorated amount of the appropriate registration fee. The bill also changes the registration period for a vessel with a valid marine document issued by the bureau of customs of the United States government or any federal agency successor thereto or for a special certificate from two to three years.

Code section 462A.5 is amended by increasing the registration fees for vessels, creating a new registration

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category for motorboats or sailboats 26 feet or more but less than 40 feet in length, with a registration fee of $\$ 40$, and creating a new category for motorboats or sailboats 40 feet in length or more, with a registration fee of $\$ 75$. The bill also provides that there is a separate registration fee for all personal watercraft of $\$ 25$.

Code section 462A.12 is amended to provide that an owner or operator of a vessel propelled by a motor of more than 10 horsepower shall not permit any person under 12 years of age to operate the vessel unless accompanied in or on the same vessel by a responsible person of at least 18 years of age who is experienced in motorboat operation. The bill also provides that a person who is 12 years of age or older but less than 18 years of age shall not operate any vessel propelled by a motor of more than 10 horsepower unless the person has successfully completed a department-approved watercraft safety course and obtained a watercraft safety certificate. A person who is required to have a watercraft safety certificate must carry and exhibit or make the certificate available upon request of an officer of the department. A violation of this provision is a simple misdemeanor, except that a person charged with a violation of this requirement shall not be convicted if the person produces the certificate in court within a reasonable time. The bill provides that the cost of the certificate shall not exceed $\$ 5$. Previously these provisions only applied to persons under 12 years of age or 12 to 18 years of age who operated a personal watercraft.

Code section 462A. 20 is amended to provide that a vessel, either for hire or offered for hire, is subject to inspection at any time rather than an annual mandatory inspection, by representatives of the natural resource commission or by any peace officer who is trained in enforcing, and who in the regular course of duty enforces, boating and navigation laws. The bill also eliminates the requirement that the owner of a vessel file an application for inspection of such vessels with

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the commission. The bill provides that an officer of the commission or any peace officer who is trained in enforcing, and who in the regular course of duty enforces, boating and navigation laws has the power to determine whether a vessel for hire is safe and upon what waters it may be used and the power to determine the seaworthiness of any private vessel. The bill eliminates the requirement that vessels that have been inspected be issued a current inspection seal that must be posted in a conspicuous place and is valid for the calendar year in which the inspection occurred.

Code section 462A. 22 is amended to provide that the annual fee for vessels for hire is $\$ 10$ for a pilot's license and $\$ 20$ for an engineer's license. The bill also provides that such fees shall be placed in the state fish and game protection fund and are appropriated solely for the administration and enforcement of programs to control aquatic invasive species, for programs to monitor and improve the water quality of the state's public lakes, and for the administration and enforcement of navigation laws and water safety upon the inland waters of this state for the fiscal period beginning July l, 2004, and ending June 30, 2010. Beginning July l, 2010, such fees are to be used for the administration and enforcement of navigation laws and water safety.

Code section 462A. 52 is amended to provide that fees collected by a county recorder for the registration of vessels shall be forwarded to the state treasurer to be placed in the state fish and game protection fund, instead of a special conservation fund. The bill provides that this money is appropriated to the commission solely for the administration and enforcement of navigation laws and water safety. The bill also provides that, notwithstanding these provisions, any increase in revenues received on or after July l, 2004, pursuant to this Code section as a result of fee increases pursuant to the bill, shall be used by the commission for the fiscal period beginning July l, 2004, and ending June 30,

## Description

Senate File 2216 changes the boat registration period from two years to three years and makes the following changes that impact the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund:

- Increases the biennial registration fee for boats with no motor from $\$ 5.00$ ( $\$ 2.50$ per year) to a triennial fee of $\$ 12.00$ ( $\$ 4.00$ per year).
- Creates a triennial $\$ 22.50$ ( $\$ 7.50$ per year) registration fee for boats with a motor that are less than 16 feet in length.
- Creates a triennial $\$ 37.50$ ( $\$ 12.50$ per year) registration fee for boats with a motor that are 16 feet but less than 26 feet in length.
- Creates a triennial $\$ 60.00$ ( $\$ 20.00$ per year) registration fee for boats with a motor that are 26 feet or more but less than 40 feet in length.
- Creates a triennial $\$ 112.50$ ( $\$ 37.50$ per year) registration fee for boats with a motor that are 40 feet in length or longer.
- Creates a triennial $\$ 37.50$ ( $\$ 12.50$ per year) registration fee for personal watercraft.
- Establishes an annual $\$ 10.00$ fee for a boat pilot license and an annual $\$ 20.00$ fee for a boat engineer.
- Defines the qualifications of a peace officer and allows a peace officer or representative of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to inspect boat for hire or offered for hire at any time.
- Requires boat operators that are between 12 and 17 years of age to complete the Watercraft Safety Course offered by the DNR.
- Specifies any operator of a vessel that has 10 or more horsepower, and is under the age of 12 , must be accompanied by a responsible person 18 years or older.
- Specifies revenue received from the fee increase will be used for administration and enforcement of programs that control aquatic invasive species, monitor and improve water quality at the State's public lakes, and enforcement of navigation laws and water safety.


## Assumptions

1. Triennial gross receipts from boat registration fee increases to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund are estimated to increase $\$ 866,000$ for FY 2005 and every third year thereafter.
2. Annual gross receipts from the sale of 85 boat pilot and 85 boat engineer licenses are estimated to be approximately $\$ 2,500$.
3. Estimated increase in expenditures for the mandatory Watercraft Safety Course is $\$ 74,000$ for FY 2005, $\$ 101,000$ for FY 2006, and $\$ 99,000$ for FY 2007.

## Fiscal Impact

The estimated fiscal impact of SF 2216 is an increase in revenue of $\$ 866,000$ to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund for FY 2005 and every third year thereafter. The estimated annual increase

- for boat pilot and boat engineer licenses to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund is expected to be $\$ 2,500$. The estimated annual increase in expenditures to the Department of Natural

Resources for the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund is \$74,000 for FY 2005, \$101,000 for FY 2006, and \$99,000 for FY 2007.
