A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the construction, location, and accessibility
- of storm shelters at manufactured home communities and mobile
- 3 home parks.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 331.301, subsection 15, paragraph a,
- 2 Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. A county may adopt and enforce an ordinance requiring
- 4 the construction of a storm shelter at a manufactured home
- 5 community or mobile home park which-is-constructed-after-July
- 6 \pm_7 - ±999 . In lieu of requiring construction of a storm
- 7 shelter, a county may require a community or park owner to
- 8 provide a plan for the evacuation of community or park
- 9 residents to a safe place of shelter in times of severe
- 10 weather including tornadoes and high winds if the-county
- 11 determines-that-a-safe-place-of an adequately constructed and
- 12 sized shelter is available within a reasonable distance of one
- 13 thousand five hundred feet of the furthest manufactured or
- 14 mobile home space in the manufactured home community or mobile
- 15 home park for immediate and twenty-four-hour use by community
- 16 or park residents as determined by the local emergency
- 17 management agency. Each evacuation plan prepared pursuant to
- 18 this subsection shall be filed with, and approved by, the
- 19 local emergency management agency. If construction of a storm
- 20 shelter is required, an ordinance adopted or enforced pursuant
- 21 to this subsection shall not include any-of the following
- 22 requirements:
- (1) That the size of the storm shelter be larger-than at
- 24 least the equivalent of seven twenty-two square feet for each
- 25 manufactured or mobile home space in the manufactured home
- 26 community or mobile home park.
- 27 (2) That the storm shelter may include a restroom if the
- 28 shelter is used exclusively as a storm shelter.
- 29 (3) That the storm shelter exceed-the-construction
- 30 specifications-approved-by-a-licensed-professional-engineer
- 31 and-presented-by-the-owner-of-the-manufactured-home-community
- 32 or-mobile-home-park be constructed in accordance with the
- 33 latest guidelines for community storm shelters adopted by the
- 34 federal emergency management agency.
- 35 (4) That the shelter be located any-closer no farther than

- 1 one thousand three two hundred twenty feet from any
- 2 manufactured or mobile home in the manufactured home community
- 3 or mobile home park.
- 4 (5) That residents of the manufactured home community or
- 5 mobile home park shall have immediate twenty-four-hour access
- 6 to the shelter during severe weather.
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 364.3, subsection 8, paragraph a, Code
- 8 2003, is amended to read as follow:
- 9 a. A city may adopt and enforce an ordinance requiring the
- 10 construction of a storm shelter at a manufactured home
- 11 community or mobile home park which-is-constructed-after-July
- 12 17-1999. In lieu of requiring construction of a storm
- 13 shelter, a city may require a community or park owner to
- 14 provide a plan for the evacuation of community or park
- 15 residents to a safe place of shelter in times of severe
- 16 weather including tornadoes and high winds if-the-city
- 17 determines-that-a-safe-place-of an adequately constructed and
- 18 sized shelter is available within a reasonable distance of one
- 19 thousand five hundred feet of the furthest manufactured or
- 20 mobile home space in the manufactured home community or mobile
- 21 home park for immediate and twenty-four-hour use by community
- 22 or park residents as determined by the local emergency

- 6 (4) That the shelter be located any-closer no farther than
- 7 one thousand three two hundred twenty feet from any
- 8 manufactured or mobile home in the community. However, this
- 9 restriction shall not prohibit the adoption or enforcement of
- 10 an ordinance that requires a minimum of one shelter to be
- 11 located in a manufactured home community or mobile home park.
- 12 (5) That residents of the manufactured home community or
- 13 mobile home park shall have immediate twenty-four-hour access
- 14 to the shelter during severe weather.
- 15 EXPLANATION
- 16 This bill provides that counties and cities who adopt an
- 17 ordinance requiring the construction of a storm shelter within
- 18 a manufactured home community and mobile home park, or
- 19 requiring an evacuation plan to a shelter outside of the
- 20 community or park, must ensure immediate 24-hour access to the
- 21 shelter by residents during severe weather. The bill rescinds
- 22 the restriction that counties and cities may only regulate
- 23 communities or parks constructed after July 1, 1999. The bill
- 24 specifies that if an evacuation plan is required, the shelter
- 25 designated in the plan shall be no more than 1,500 feet from
- 26 the furthest manufactured or mobile home space in the
- 27 community or park and must be adequately constructed as
- 28 approved by the local emergency management agency. The bill
- 29 increases the required maximum size of a shelter from seven
- 30 square feet to 22 square feet for each manufactured or mobile
- 31 home space within the community or park. The bill decreases
- 32 the required maximum distance between a shelter and any
- 33 manufactured or mobile home within the community or park from
- 34 1,320 feet to 1,200 feet. The bill provides that restrooms
- 35 may be built in the shelter instead of not requiring restrooms

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1 where the shelter is exclusively used as a storm shelter.
 2 bill provides that the shelter must be constructed according
 3 to the latest standards adopted by the federal emergency
4 management agency rather than the specifications of a licensed
 5 engineer and the owner of the community or park.
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
