A licensed podiatric physician may administer local 8 anesthesia. Conscious sedation may be administered by a 9 licensed podiatric physician in a hospital or an ambulatory 10 surgical center. A licensed podiatric physician may prescribe and administer 11 12 drugs for the treatment of human foot ailments as provided in 13 section 149.1. 14 **EXPLANATION** 15 This bill relates to the administration of anesthesia by a 16 podiatrist.
