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- 1 Section 1. Section 321.34, subsection 11, Code 2003, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 11. NATURAL RESOURCES PLATES.
- 4 a. Upon application and payment of the proper fees, the
- 5 director may issue natural resources plates to the owner of a
- 6 motor vehicle subject to registration under section 321.109,
- 7 subsection 1, light delivery truck, panel delivery truck,
- 8 pickup, motor home, multipurpose vehicle, motorcycle, trailer,
- 9 or travel trailer.
- 10 b. Natural resources plates shall be designed by the
- 11 department in cooperation with the department of natural
- 12 resources which design shall include on the plate the name of
- 13 the county where the vehicle is registered.
- 14 c. The special natural resources fee for letter number
- 15 designated natural resources plates is thirty-five forty-five
- 16 dollars. The fee for personalized natural resources plates is
- 17 forty-five dollars which shall be paid in addition to the
- 18 special natural resources fee of thirty-five forty-five
- 19 dollars. The fees collected by the director under this
- 20 subsection shall be paid monthly to the treasurer of state and
- 21 credited to the road use tax fund. Notwithstanding section
- 22 423.24, and prior to the crediting of revenues to the road use
- 23 tax fund under section 423.24, subsection 1, paragraph "b",
- 24 the treasurer of state shall credit monthly from those
- 25 revenues to the Iowa resources enhancement and protection fund

- 29 From the moneys credited to the Iowa resources enhancement

The county treasurer shall 3 validate the special registration plates in the same manner as 4 regular registration plates are validated under this section. 5 The annual special natural resources fee for letter number 6 designated plates is ten twenty-five dollars which shall be 7 paid in addition to the regular annual registration fee. 8 annual fee for personalized natural resources plates is five 9 dollars which shall be paid in addition to the annual special 10 natural resources fee and the regular annual registration fee. 11 The annual special natural resources fee shall be credited as 12 provided under paragraph "c". 13 **EXPLANATION** 14 This bill increases the fee for special natural resources 15 motor vehicle registration plates from \$35 to \$45. 16 renewal fee is increased from \$10 to \$25. 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SF 380 - REAP Plate Fees (LSB 2098 SV)

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Fiscal Note Version – New

Description

Senate File 380 increases the fees for the initial issuance of special natural resources license plates from \$35 to \$45. The Bill also increases renewal fees for the plates from \$10 to \$25. Revenues collected from the fee increases will be transferred from the lowa Resources Enhancement and Protection (REAP) Fund to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Wildlife Bureau to be used for nongame wildlife programs.

Assumptions

- 1. The number of new natural resources license plates issued annually is unknown.
- 2. There are approximately 52,000 renewals issued annually, of which approximately 50,000 are for nonpersonalized plates and 2,000 for personalized plates.
- 3. Under current law, approximately \$520,000 is credited annually to the REAP Fund from fees collected for renewal of natural resources plates. Of that amount, approximately \$500,000 is generated from nonpersonalized plates and \$20,000 from personalized plates.
- 4. Under SF 380, an estimated additional \$780,000 will be credited annually to the REAP Fund from fees collected for renewals. Of that amount, approximately \$750,000 will be generated from nonpersonalized plates and \$30,000 from personalized plates.
- 5. Under the proposed law, the additional fees collected from the natural resources plates will be used to match federal funds allocated to the DNR for nongame wildlife programs.
- 6. The DNR is eligible to receive an estimated \$2.3 million in federal funds as follows:
 - FFY 2001: \$609,000
 - FFY 2002: \$976,000
 - FFY 2003: \$732,000
- 7. Prior to receiving the federal funds, the DNR is required to provide the following match for each year the funds are allocated. The total match for FFY 2001 through FFY 2003 is approximately \$1.9 million:

- 8. Of the total \$1.9 million required State match, the DNR has provided \$683,000 to date, which was borrowed from the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund. The DNR expects to collect approximately \$534,000 from private donations and other grants, and will use that money to help repay the \$683,000 borrowed from the Trust Fund. The remaining \$149,000 represents a loss to the Trust Fund.
- 9. The remaining moneys that the DNR is required to match in order to receive the full allotment of federal funds is approximately \$1.2 million as follows:
 - \$100,000 for FFY 2001
 - \$384,000 for FFY 2002
 - \$732,000 for FFY 2003

- 10. The federal funds are allocated on a per project basis. Once a project is approved and funds are expended, the DNR requests federal reimbursement for that specific project, to the federal match limit allowed by the grant. To date, the DNR borrows the remaining balance from the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund.
- 11. In addition to providing the \$1.2 million match, the DNR intends to repay the \$149,000 lost from the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund.
- 12. It is unknown if the DNR will receive additional private donations to assist in meeting the match dollars.
- 13. The DNR does not intend to borrow additional moneys from the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund, unless other sources of matching money are assured.

Fiscal Impact

The estimated fiscal impact of SF 380 to the Department of Natural Resources cannot be determined, as it is unknown how many new natural resources plates will be sold annually. The following is an example of the amount of revenue that would be generated based on the sale of 52,000 license plate renewals:

^{*} Additional revenues collected will be credited to the REAP Fund and transferred to the Wildlife Bureau of the Department of Natural Resources.

The DNR will use the additional revenues collected under SF 380 to assist in providing a State match of \$1.2 million. The match is a requirement for the DNR to receive \$1.2 million in federal funds for FFY 2001 through FFY 2003 for nongame wildlife programs.

To receive the full allotment of FFY 2001 and FFY 2002 federal funds, the DNR must provide a match of approximately \$484,000 by October 1, 2003. To receive the full allotment of FFY 2003 federal funds, the DNR must provide a match of approximately \$732,000 by October 1, 2004.

The additional revenues collected under SF 380 will also be used to assist in repaying the \$149,000 remaining loan balance from the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund of the Department of Natural Resources.
