A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations from the healthy
2 Iowans tobacco trust and the tobacco settlement trust fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 454

1 Section 1. HEALTHY IOWANS TOBACCO TRUST -- APPROPRIATIONS
2 TO DEPARTMENTS. There is appropriated from the healthy Iowans
3 tobacco trust created in section 12.65 to the following
4 departments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and
5 ending June 30, 2004, the following amounts, or so much
6 thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
7 designated:

8 1. To the department of human services:

9 a. Unless otherwise provided, to maintain the
10 reimbursement rate for all noninstitutional medical assistance
11 providers, with the exception of anesthesia and dental
12 services, at the rate provided under the federal Medicare
13 program for such providers during the fiscal year beginning
14 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, as specified in 2000
15 Iowa Acts, chapter 1221, section 1, subsection 1, paragraph
16 "a", for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, through June 30, 2004,
17 and to continue the resource-based relative value system of
18 reimbursement under the medical assistance program:

30 300x-26 and section 453A.2.

31 (2) Of the full-time equivalent positions funded under
32 this section, two full-time equivalent positions shall be
33 utilized to provide for enforcement of tobacco laws,
34 regulations, and ordinances under a chapter 28D agreement
35 entered into between the Iowa department of public health and

1 the alcoholic beverages division of the department of
2 commerce.

3 (3) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "a", not

11 b. For provision of smoking cessation products as provided

35 paragraph "c" to develop a results-based funding approach for

1 substance abuse treatment services.

2 (5) The department shall use funds appropriated in this
3 paragraph "c" to develop a program to encourage individuals
4 who are successfully managing their substance abuse problems
5 to serve as role models.

6 (6) The department shall submit a report annually by March
7 1, to the governor and the general assembly delineating the
8 success rates of the substance abuse treatment programs that
9 receive funding under this paragraph "c".

10 d. For the healthy Iowans 2010 plan within the Iowa
11 department of public health and for not more than the
12 following full-time equivalent positions:

15 (1) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "d", not
16 more than \$1,157,482 shall be used for core public health
17 functions, including home health care and public health
18 nursing services, contracted through a formula by local boards
19 of health, to enhance disease and injury prevention services.

20 (2) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "d", not
21 more than \$387,320 shall be used for the continuation and
22 support of a coordinated system of delivery of trauma and
23 emergency medical services.

24 (3) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "d", not
25 more than \$437,000 shall be used for the state poison control
26 center.

27 (4) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "d", not
28 more than \$141,810 shall be used for the development of
29 scientific and medical expertise in environmental
30 epidemiology.

31 (5) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "d", not
32 more than \$76,388 shall be used for the childhood lead
33 poisoning prevention program.

34 6. To the department of corrections:

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1 a. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, \$127,217

8 the drug court program.

9 c. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, \$191,731
10 is allocated to the fourth judicial district department of

13 is allocated to the fifth judicial district department of
14 correctional services to replace expired funding for the drug
15 court program.

16 e. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection \$250,000
17 is allocated to the Newton correctional facility for a value-
18 based treatment program.

19 Sec. 2. PURCHASE OF SERVICE CONTRACT PROVIDERS --
20 REIMBURSEMENT INCREASE. There is appropriated from the
21 healthy Iowans tobacco trust created in section 12.65 to the
22 property tax relief fund created in section 426B.1 for the
23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004,
24 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
25 be used for the purposes designated:

27 health, mental retardation, and developmental disabilities
28 services fund balances which were selected in accordance with
29 2000 Iowa Acts, chapter 1221, section 3, to receive such

5 for distribution as provided in this section:

7 Sec. 4. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS -- SPECIAL NEEDS UNIT.

8 There is appropriated from the healthy Iowans tobacco trust
9 created in section 12.65, to the department of corrections for
10 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30,
11 2004, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
12 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

13 For operating the special needs unit at the Fort Madison
14 correctional facility and for not more than the following
15 full-time equivalent positions:

18 Sec. 5. RISK POOL APPROPRIATION -- TRANSFER.

19 Notwithstanding 2002 Iowa Acts, chapter 1175, section
20 104, subsection 1, paragraph "b", as amended by 2003
21 Iowa Acts, House File 667, section 41, if enacted,
22 moneys appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July
23 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, for deposit in the
24 risk pool pursuant to that paragraph shall be
25 transferred to the medical assistance appropriation
26 for the same fiscal year.

27 Sec. 6. ENDOWMENT FOR IOWA'S HEALTH ACCOUNT --

28 TRANSFER. In addition to the amount transferred
29 pursuant to section 12E.12, subsection 1, paragraph

31 \$4,600,000 is transferred from the endowment for

1 EXPLANATION

2 This bill relates to and makes appropriations from the
3 healthy Iowans tobacco trust.

4 The bill makes appropriations to the department of human
5 services for the following:

6 1. Unless otherwise provided, to maintain the
7 reimbursement rate for all noninstitutional providers at the
8 rate paid under the federal Medicare program during FY 2000-
9 2001, and for continuation of the resource-based relative
10 value system, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and
11 ending June 30, 2004.

12 2. To maintain the reimbursement rate for dental services
13 at the usual and customary rate as provided during FY 2000-
14 2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending
15 June 30, 2004.

16 3. To maintain the reimbursement rate for hospitals as
17 provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning
18 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

19 4. To maintain the reimbursement rate for home health
20 agencies at the rate provided to such agencies as provided
21 during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
22 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

23 5. To maintain the reimbursement rate for critical access
24 hospitals at the rate provided such hospitals under the
25 federal Medicare program during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal
26 year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

27 6. To maintain the expansion of home health care services
28 and habilitative day care services under the medical
29 assistance program for children with special needs.

30 7. To maintain the expansion of respite care services
31 provided through home and community-based waiver services
32 under the medical assistance program.

33 8. To maintain the cost-of-living adjustment for
34 rehabilitative treatment services providers as provided during
35 FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and

1 ending June 30, 2004.

2 9. To maintain the cost-of-living adjustment for adoption,
3 independent living, shelter care, and home studies services
4 providers as provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year
5 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

6 10. To maintain the reimbursement rate as provided during
7 FY 2000-2001 for service providers under the purview of the
8 department of human services.

9 The bill provides for supplementation of the appropriation
10 for the children's health insurance program.

11 The bill appropriates funds to the department of human
12 services to provide coverage under the medical assistance
13 program to certain women who require treatment for breast or
14 cervical cancer.

15 The bill provides for supplementation of the medical
16 assistance appropriation.

17 The bill appropriates funds to the Iowa department of
18 public health for the tobacco use prevention and control
19 program and for additional substance abuse treatment. Under
20 this appropriation, the department is directed to enhance the
21 quality of and to expand capacity to provide 24-hour substance
22 abuse treatment programs for children; to expand the length of
23 individual client substance abuse treatment plans, as
24 necessary to reduce recidivism; to share research-based best
25 practices for treatment with substance abuse treatment
26 facilities; to develop a results-based funding approach for
27 substance abuse treatment services; and to develop a program
28 to encourage individuals who are successfully managing their
29 substance abuse problems to serve as role models.

30 The bill appropriates funds to the Iowa department of
31 public health for development of a healthy Iowans 2010 plan
32 for the following purposes: for core public health functions
33 including home health care and public health nursing services
34 contracted through a formula by local boards of health, to
35 enhance disease and injury prevention services; for the

1 implementation and support of a coordinated system of delivery
2 of trauma and emergency medical services; for the poison
3 control center; for development of scientific and medical
4 expertise in environmental epidemiology; and for the childhood
5 lead poisoning prevention program. The bill appropriates
6 funds to the Iowa department of public health for smoking
7 cessation products.

8 The bill appropriates funds to the department of
9 corrections for day programming, the drug court program, and a
10 value-based treatment program.

11 The bill appropriates funds to the property tax relief fund
12 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June
13 30, 2004, for assistance to counties with limited county
14 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental
15 disabilities services fund balances to pay reimbursement
16 increases in the same amount as provided in the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.

18 The bill appropriates funds from the healthy Iowans tobacco
19 trust to the Iowa empowerment fund for the fiscal year
20 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, for deposit
21 in the school ready children grants account.

22 The bill appropriates funds to the department of
23 corrections from the healthy Iowans tobacco trust for
24 operation and staffing of a special needs unit at the Fort
25 Madison correctional facility.

26 The bill transfers moneys appropriated for the county
27 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental
28 disabilities allowed growth factor adjustment for the risk
29 pool for fiscal year 2003-2004 to the medical assistance
30 appropriation.

31 The bill also transfers additional moneys from the
32 endowment for Iowa's health account to the healthy Iowans
33 tobacco trust for fiscal year 2003-2004.

EXPLANATION

2 This bill relates to and makes appropriations from the
3 healthy Iowans tobacco trust.

4 The bill makes appropriations to the department of human
5 services for the following:

6 1. Unless otherwise provided, to maintain the
7 reimbursement rate for all noninstitutional providers at the
8 rate paid under the federal Medicare program during FY 2000-
9 2001, and for continuation of the resource-based relative
10 value system, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and
11 ending June 30, 2004.

12 2. To maintain the reimbursement rate for dental services
13 at the usual and customary rate as provided during FY 2000-
14 2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending
15 June 30, 2004.

16 3. To maintain the reimbursement rate for hospitals as
17 provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning
18 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

19 4. To maintain the reimbursement rate for home health
20 agencies at the rate provided to such agencies as provided
21 during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
22 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

23 5. To maintain the reimbursement rate for critical access
24 hospitals at the rate provided such hospitals under the
25 federal Medicare program during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal
26 year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

27 6. To maintain the expansion of home health care services
28 and habilitative day care services under the medical
29 assistance program for children with special needs.

30 7. To maintain the expansion of respite care services
31 provided through home and community-based waiver services

3 independent living, shelter care, and home studies services
4 providers as provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year
5 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.

6 10. To maintain the reimbursement rate as provided during
7 FY 2000-2001 for service providers under the purview of the
8 department of human services.

9 The bill provides for supplementation of the appropriation
10 for the children's health insurance program.

11 The bill appropriates funds to the department of human
12 services to provide coverage under the medical assistance
13 program to certain women who require treatment for breast or
14 cervical cancer.

15 The bill provides for supplementation of the medical
16 assistance appropriation.

17 The bill appropriates funds to the Iowa department of
18 public health for the tobacco use prevention and control
19 program and for additional substance abuse treatment. Under
20 this appropriation, the department is directed to enhance the
21 quality of and to expand capacity to provide 24-hour substance
22 abuse treatment programs for children; to expand the length of
23 individual client substance abuse treatment plans, as
24 necessary to reduce recidivism; to share research-based best
25 practices for treatment with substance abuse treatment
26 facilities; to develop a results-based funding approach for
27 substance abuse treatment services; and to develop a program
28 to encourage individuals who are successfully managing their
29 substance abuse problems to serve as role models.

30 The bill appropriates funds to the Iowa department of
31 public health for development of a healthy Iowans 2010 plan
32 for the following purposes: for core public health functions
33 including home health care and public health nursing services
34 contracted through a formula by local boards of health, to
35 enhance disease and injury prevention services; for the

1 implementation and support of a coordinated system of delivery
2 of trauma and emergency medical services; for the poison
3 control center; for development of scientific and medical
4 expertise in environmental epidemiology; and for the childhood
5 lead poisoning prevention program. The bill appropriates
6 funds to the Iowa department of public health for smoking
7 cessation products.

8 The bill appropriates funds to the department of
9 corrections for day programming, the drug court program, and a
10 value-based treatment program.

11 The bill appropriates funds to the property tax relief fund
12 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June
13 30, 2004, for assistance to counties with limited county
14 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental
15 disabilities services fund balances to pay reimbursement
16 increases in the same amount as provided in the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.

18 The bill appropriates funds from the healthy Iowans tobacco
19 trust to the Iowa empowerment fund for the fiscal year
20 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, for deposit
21 in the school ready children grants account.

22 The bill appropriates funds to the department of
23 corrections from the healthy Iowans tobacco trust for
24 operation and staffing of a special needs unit at the Fort
25 Madison correctional facility.

26 The bill transfers moneys appropriated for the county
27 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental
28 disabilities allowed growth factor adjustment for the risk
29 pool for fiscal year 2003-2004 to the medical assistance
30 appropriation.

31 The bill also transfers additional moneys from the
32 endowment for Iowa's health account to the healthy Iowans
33 tobacco trust for fiscal year 2003-2004.

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
