SF 46 LOCAL GOVERNMENT

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 331.309 ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES
2 BY PETITION AND ELECTION.

3 1. The board of supervisors of a county may adopt an
4 ordinance providing for the right of the people to propose
5 ordinances by petition for submission to the voters at an
6 election. Such proposed ordinances are limited in subject to
7 matters under the jurisdiction of the board of supervisors.

8 2. For purposes of this section, "ordinance" means a
9 county law of a general and permanent nature, and includes a
10 proposition adopting, amending, or repealing a new or existing
11 law, policy, or plan. An ordinance does not include a
12 proposition providing for the execution or administration of a
13 law, policy, or plan already adopted by the board.

14 3. a. Upon receipt of a valid petition containing the
15 signatures of eligible electors in the county equal in number
16 to five percent of those voting in the county for the office
17 of governor or president at the last preceding general
18 election, the board of supervisors shall direct the county
19 commissioner of elections to call an election on the matter.

20 b. The resolution submitted by the board must be received
21 by the commissioner of elections not less than thirty-two days
22 before the election and must include all of the following:

23 (1) The proposed date of the election which may be the
24 same day as another election if the elections do not conflict
25 as provided in section 47.6.

26 (2) The full text of the proposed ordinance to be
27 presented to the voters of the county.

28 (3) The date the ordinance will become effective if
29 approved by the voters.

30 4. The county commissioner of elections shall conduct the
31 election in the manner provided by chapters 39 through 53, as
32 applicable.

33 5. The right to petition for adoption of an ordinance by
34 election shall not extend to any of the following:

35 a. Any measure of an executive or administrative nature.

- 1 b. The county budget.
- 2 c. The appropriation of money.
- 3 d. The levy of taxes or special assessments.
- 4 e. The issuance of general obligation bonds or revenue
- 5 bonds.
- 6 f. The letting of contracts.
- 7 g. Salaries of county employees.
- 8 h. Emergency ordinances relating to the health, safety,
- 9 and welfare of the citizens of the county.
- 10 i. Any measure required to be enacted by state or federal
- 11 law.
- 12 j. Amendments affecting the county zoning ordinance.

13 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 364.26 ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE BY
14 PETITION AND ELECTION.

15 1. The city council of a city may adopt an ordinance
16 providing for the right of the people to propose ordinances by
17 petition for submission to the voters at an election. Such
18 proposed ordinances are limited in subject to matters under
19 the jurisdiction of the city council.

20 2. For purposes of this section, "ordinance" means a city
21 law of a general and permanent nature, and includes a
22 proposition adopting, amending, or repealing a new or existing
23 law, policy, or plan. An ordinance does not include a
24 proposition providing for the execution or administration of a
25 law, policy, or plan already adopted by the city council.

26 3. a. Upon receipt of a valid petition containing the
27 signatures of eligible electors in the city equal in number to
28 five percent of those voting in the city for the office of
29 governor or president at the last preceding general election,
30 the city council shall direct the county commissioner of
31 elections to call an election on the matter.

32 b. The resolution submitted by the city council must be
33 received by the commissioner of elections not less than
34 thirty-two days before the election and must include all of
35 the following:

1 (1) The proposed date of the election which may be the
2 same day as another election if the elections do not conflict
3 as provided in section 47.6.

4 (2) The full text of the proposed ordinance to be
5 presented to the voters of the city.

6 (3) The date the ordinance will become effective if
7 approved by the voters.

8 4. The county commissioner of elections shall conduct the
9 election in the manner provided by chapters 39 through 53, as
10 applicable.

11 5. The right to petition for adoption of an ordinance by
12 election shall not extend to any of the following:

13 a. Any measure of an executive or administrative nature.

14 b. The city budget.

15 c. The appropriation of money.

17 e. The issuance of general obligation bonds or revenue
18 bonds.

19 f. The letting of contracts.

20 g. Salaries of city employees.

21 h. Emergency ordinances relating to the health, safety,
22 and welfare of the citizens of the city.

23 i. Any measure required to be enacted by state or federal
24 law.

25 j. Amendments affecting the city zoning ordinance.

26 EXPLANATION

27 This bill allows cities and counties to adopt an ordinance
28 granting the people the power to petition for a proposed
29 ordinance to be placed on the ballot. The subject matter of
30 an ordinance proposed by petition may be any subject under the
31 jurisdiction of the city council or board of supervisors,
32 except for matters pertaining to the budget and appropriation
33 of money, the levy of taxes and special assessments, the
34 issuance of bonds, the letting of contracts, city or county
35 employee salaries, emergencies, and zoning. The bill also

1 does not allow petitioned ordinances on any measure of an
2 executive or administrative nature and any measure required to
3 be enacted by state or federal law.
