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1 DIVISION XV 2 BODY PIERCING 3 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 135.140 BODY PIERCING -- PERMIT 4 REQUIRED -- MINORS -- PENALTY. 5 1. For the purposes of this section: 6 "Body piercing" means for commercial purposes the act a. 7 of penetrating the skin to make a hole, mark, or scar for the 8 purposes of ornamentation. "Body piercing" does not include 9 the use of a mechanized, presterilized, ear-piercing system 10 that penetrates the outer perimeter or lobe of the ear, or 11 both. 12 "Minor" means an unmarried person who is under the age b. 13 of eighteen years. "Parent" means a parent, legal guardian, or legal 14 c. 15 custodian of a minor. 16 2. A person shall not own, control, or lease, act as an 17 agent for, conduct, manage, or operate an establishment to 18 practice body piercing or engage in body piercing without 19 first applying for and receiving a permit from the Iowa 20 department of public health. Permits shall be renewed on an 21 annual basis. 22 3. An individual shall not engage in the practice of a. 23 body piercing without first obtaining a blood test from a 24 health care professional or laboratory licensed to perform or 25 provide a blood test, the results of which confirm that the 26 individual is not infected with a contagious or infectious 27 disease as defined in section 139A.2, or HIV or AIDS as 28 defined in section 141A.1. b. An applicant for a permit to engage in the practice of 29 30 body piercing shall obtain a blood test as prescribed in 31 paragraph "a". The applicant shall include a statement in the 32 application attesting to the fact that the individual has been 33 tested and has obtained negative results in accordance with 34 paragraph "a". The individual shall maintain documentation of 35 the testing and results of testing. An applicant shall obtain

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1 a blood test pursuant to this subsection annually prior to 2 application for renewal of a permit.

3 4. A minor shall not undergo body piercing and a person 4 shall not provide body piercing to a minor unless the written 5 consent of a parent of the minor has been obtained prior to 6 any body piercing being provided.

7 5. The department shall do all of the following:
8 a. Prescribe the form used in obtaining written consent
9 from the parent of a minor under this section.

b. Establish minimum safety and sanitation criteria for
11 the operation of an establishment that provides body piercing.
12 c. Establish standards for individuals engaging in the
13 practice of body piercing.

d. Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A and establish and
15 collect all fees necessary to administer this section. The
16 provisions of chapter 17A including licensing provisions,
17 judicial review, and appeal shall apply to this section.

18 6. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a 19 person who practices body piercing pursuant to a recognized 20 religious doctrine or cultural practice upon persons for whom 21 the undergoing of body piercing has religious or cultural 22 significance. The performance of body piercing pursuant to 23 this subsection shall, however, be subject to review by the 24 department with regard to the existence of an asserted 25 religious doctrine or cultural practice and with regard to the 26 observance of safety and sanitation standards.

7. A person who fails to meet the requirements of
subsection 2 or 3, or who provides body piercing to a minor in
violation of subsection 4, is guilty of a serious misdemeanor.
8. If the department determines that this section has been
or is being violated, the department may order that a person
cease providing body piercing until the necessary corrective
action has been taken. If the person continues to provide
body piercing in violation of the order of the department, the

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1 attorney general make an application in the name of the state 2 to the district court of the county in which the violation has 3 occurred for an order to enjoin the violation. This remedy is 4 in addition to any other legal remedy available to the 5 department.

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## EXPLANATION

7 This bill requires a person who owns, controls, or leases, 8 acts as an agent for, conducts, manages, or operates an 9 establishment to practice body piercing or to engage in body 10 piercing to apply for and receive a state permit. The permit 11 is to be renewed on an annual basis.

12 The bill also prohibits an individual from engaging in the 13 practice of body piercing unless the individual has first 14 obtained a blood test from a health care professional or 15 laboratory licensed to perform or provide a blood test, the 16 results of which test confirm that the individual is not 17 infected with a contagious or infectious disease or HIV or 18 AIDS. Additionally, an applicant for a permit to engage in 19 the practice of body piercing is to obtain the blood test 20 prescribed in the bill and is then to include a statement in 21 the application attesting to the fact that the individual has 22 been tested and has obtained negative results. The bill 23 directs the individual to maintain documentation of the 24 testing and results of testing. The applicant for a permit to 25 engage in the practice of body piercing is to obtain a blood 26 test annually prior to application for renewal of a permit. The bill also prohibits a minor from undergoing body 27 28 piercing and prohibits a person from providing body piercing 29 to a minor unless the person obtains the written consent of a 30 parent of the minor prior to the provision of any body 31 piercing. A person who does not obtain a permit or comply 32 with permitting requirements, or who provides body piercing in 33 violation of the bill, is guilty of a serious misdemeanor. 34 The bill directs the Iowa department of public health to 35 prescribe the form to be used in obtaining a parent's written

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1 consent, to establish minimum safety and sanitation criteria 2 for the operation of an establishment that provides body 3 piercing, to establish standards for individuals engaging in 4 the practice of body piercing, to adopt rules pursuant to Code 5 chapter 17A, and to establish and collect all fees necessary 6 to administer the bill.

7 The provisions of the bill do not apply to a person who 8 practices body piercing pursuant to a recognized religious 9 doctrine or cultural practice upon persons for whom the 10 undergoing of body piercing has religious or cultural 11 significance. However, such performance of body piercing is 12 subject to review by the department with regard to the 13 existence of an asserted religious doctrine or cultural 14 practice and with regard to the observance of safety and 15 sanitation standards.

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
