6	WHEREAS, according to the Iowa Department of Public
	Health's Healthy Iowans 2010 report, in the United
	States suicide is the ninth leading cause of death
	overall, the third leading cause of death for persons
	ages 15 to 24, the sixth leading cause of death for
	persons ages five to 15, and suicide rates are high
	among the elderly; and
13	WHEREAS, in Iowa, the report indicates suicide
	deaths average 306 per year and according to the
	federal government's National Strategy for Suicide
16	Prevention it is estimated there are five suicide
17	attempts for every death; and
18	WHEREAS, analysis of the national strategy
19	information indicates in 1996 medical costs relating
20	to suicide attempts and deaths by young people were
21	estimated at \$14 million, loss of future earnings
22	totaled \$44 million, and loss of quality of life costs
23	amounted to \$174 million; and
24	WHEREAS, the Healthy Iowans 2010 report stresses
25	the importance of raising community awareness about
26	the need for early intervention and recognition of
27	Iowa citizens who are potentially at risk for suicide,
2 8	particularly youth and the elderly; and
29	WHEREAS, Iowa's Suicide Prevention Strategy
30	Steering Committee, a group of educators, mental

1 health and public health workers, counselors, 2 physicians, and others, have requested that suicide 3 prevention be identified as a state goal; NOW 4 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, That the Senate 6 identifies suicide as a serious problem affecting the 7 entire state and that a variety of suicide prevention 8 programs are needed for all populations and in all 9 communities in the state: and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Senate supports 11 development of the following suicide prevention 12 initiatives: responding to persons at risk for 13 suicide and persons who have attempted suicide, 14 promoting safe and effective treatment for persons at 15 risk for suicidal behavior, supporting persons who 16 have lost someone to suicide, and developing an 17 effective statewide strategy for the prevention of 18 suicide; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Senate encourages 20 the development and promotion of accessible and 21 affordable mental health services to enable all 22 persons who are at risk for suicide to obtain these 23 services without fear of any stigma. 24 25 26 27 28 29 30
