8	intoxicated is a serious criminal offense; and
9	WHEREAS, the criminal penalties for first, second,
L O	and third degree operating-while-intoxicated offenses
Ll	are complex, which necessitates the need to uniformly
L 2	and consistently enforce such penalties throughout the
13	state; NOW THEREFORE,
14	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, That the legislative
15	council is requested to establish an interim study
L 6	committee to review the criminal penalties provided
17	for operating-while-intoxicated offenses. The charge
18	of the committee shall include, but is not limited to,
19	reviewing the uniformity and consistency of operating-
20	while-intoxicated enforcement, including statewide
21	application of the law for offenders charged with a
22	first, second, or third offense, and for offenders
23	with multiple pending charges for operating while
24	intoxicated. The committee shall study methods in
25	other states and in Iowa to determine the most
26	effective methods to reduce recidivism. The committee
27	shall also review any federal law or pending federal
28	law changes related to operating-while-intoxicated
29	offenses.
30	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of the

1 interim study committee shall include five members of 2 the senate and five members of the house of 3 representatives. The members of the interim study 4 committee shall also include a representative of the 5 department of transportation, the department of public 6 safety, the county attorneys association, the supreme 7 court, mothers against drunk driving, and a 8 representative of distributors of ignition interlock 9 devices.
