10	of four is \$18,400; and
11	WHEREAS, an individual would have to earn an hourly
12	wage of \$8.85 to maintain a family of four at the
13	federal poverty threshold; and
14	WHEREAS, the federal minimum wage for covered,
15	nonexempt employees is \$5.15 per hour; and
16	WHEREAS, a person earning the minimum wage would
17	have a yearly income of \$10,712; and
18	WHEREAS, more than 100,000 Iowans earn at or near
19	the minimum wage; and
20	WHEREAS, the General Assembly recognizes that
21	independence and dignity come with earning a living
22	wage; NOW THEREFORE,
23	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, That the Legislative
	Council is requested to establish an interim committee
	to review the economic, fiscal, and social impact of
	the establishment of a living wage in Iowa; and
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of the
	interim committee include representatives of labor
	organizations and small and large businesses,
30	authorities representing the appropriate fields of
