3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4
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 type. card.Section 1. NEW SECTION. 1.19 PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION. If personal identification is required to participate in any activity or to conduct any transaction with the state or a political subdivision of the state, a consular identification card may be accepted as a means of identification. The card must be issued by a consulate of a foreign nation and the consulate must be located in the United States. A consular identification card may be used for identification purposes only and does not convey a right to receive benefits of any

The consular identification card shall not be used to obtain an Iowa driver's license or a nonoperator's identification card.

Sec. 2. Section 321.182, Code 2005, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 5. Provide proof of identity as required by the department, except that a consular identification card recognized pursuant to section 1.19 shall not be used as proof of identity to obtain an Iowa driver's license or a nonoperator's identification card.

EXPLANATION
This bill allows a state or local government entity to accept a consular identification card as a means of identification. However, such a card cannot be used to obtain an Iowa driver's license or a nonoperator's identification
