- 1 Section 1. Section 303.3C, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code
- 2 Supplement 2005, is amended by striking the paragraph.
- 3 Sec. 2. Section 303.3C, subsection 3, paragraph b, Code
- 4 Supplement 2005, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 b. Identify three Iowa great places projects for purposes
- 6 of receiving a package of resources under the program.
- 7 Sec. 3. Section 303.3C, Code Supplement 2005, is amended
- 8 by adding the following new subsection:
- 9 NEW SUBSECTION. 4. a. Notwithstanding any restriction,
- 10 requirement, or duty to the contrary, in considering an
- 11 application for a grant, loan, or other financial assistance
- 12 from a city or county where an Iowa great places project has
- 13 been identified, a state agency may give preference to such
- 14 applications. This subsection applies to applications filed
- 15 within five years of the Iowa great places project
- 16 identification; however, the Iowa great places board may
- 17 extend the time period for which this subsection applies by
- 18 one year not more than three times.
- 19 b. By January 15 of each year, a state agency that gives
- 20 preference to an application where an Iowa great places
- 21 project has been identified pursuant to paragraph "a" shall
- 22 submit a report to the general assembly summarizing all
- 23 actions taken by the state agency pursuant to paragraph "a"
- 24 during the previous year.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- 26 This bill relates to projects identified under the Iowa
- 27 great places program.
- 28 Currently, under the program, three Iowa great places
- 29 projects are to be identified by the Iowa great places board,
- 30 and two years after the third project is identified,
- 31 additional projects may be identified. The bill eliminates
- 32 the two-year waiting period for identifying additional
- 33 projects.
- 34 The bill provides that, notwithstanding any restriction,
- 35 requirement, or duty to the contrary, in considering an

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1 application for a grant, loan, or other financial assistance
 2 from a city or county where an Iowa great places project has
 3 been identified, a state agency may provide preference to such
 4 applications. The bill provides that the preference
 5 provisions apply to applications filed within five years of
 6 the Iowa great places project identification; however, the
 7 Iowa great places board may extend the time period by one year
 8 not more than three times. The bill also includes a reporting
 9 requirement for state agencies that apply the preferences
10 created under the bill.
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
