Description

House File 2346 requires school districts to post specified financial information on their websites or at specified locations throughout the district if the district does not have a website.

- School districts are to provide a complete listing of outstanding levies by rate, amount, duration, and applicable levy limitations prior to certifying a levy by school board approval or submitting a levy for voter approval.
- School districts are to create a financial report that identifies property tax levies, income surtaxes, local option sales taxes, per pupil funding from state and federal sources, teacher and administrator salary levels and increases, teacher and administrator health insurance, other benefit information, teacher and administrator employment statistics for the preceding five years, and additional information determined by the district.

Assumptions

- The Bill does not appropriate funds for the report, so school districts will absorb the costs for accumulating the data and posting it to the website. The Department of Education and the Superintendents Advisory Committee project staff-time costs of approximately \$2,200 per school district for the first year to develop and post the report, and insignificant staff-time costs for maintenance in future years.
- 2. The Department of Education and Department of Management collect some of the required information. The departments will assist school districts by supplying the districts with that information.
- 3. The Bill does not address standardization of the data included in the reports. To the extent that districts use different definitions and calculations for the data presented in the reports, comparability across districts will be lost, and accountability will be reduced as one district cannot be readily compared to another district.

Fiscal Impact

House File 2346 does not create additional costs for the State General Fund or local property taxes. The school districts, Department of Education, and Department of Management will experience opportunity costs for staff time allocated to this project instead of other work.
