A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act restricting sales of Iowa prison industries products to
 2 Iowans.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- Section 1. Section 904.815, Code 2005, is amended to read 2 as follows:

 904.815 SALE OF PRODUCTS.

 1. Iowa state industries may produce and sell products to
- 5 any tax-supported institution or governmental subdivision in
- 6 any level of government which includes the state, county,
- 7 city, or school corporation that is located in Iowa. Iowa
- 8 state industries may sell products to employees of those
- 9 entities who reside in Iowa.
- 10 2. Iowa state industries may sell products to nonprofit
- 11 organizations that are located in Iowa, including parochial
- 12 schools, churches, or fraternal organizations.
- 13 3. Iowa state industries may sell products to nonprofit
- 14 health care facilities serving Medicaid or social security
- 15 patients that are located in Iowa.
- 16 EXPLANATION
- 17 This bill provides that Iowa state prison industries can
- 18 sell products only to governments and schools and their
- 19 employees, nonprofit organizations, and nonprofit health care
- 20 facilities that are located in Iowa.

Description

House File 2415 provides that Iowa Prison Industries can no longer sell products outside the State of Iowa.

Background

- 1. Iowa Prison Industries is self-funded and operates without General Fund support.
- lowa Prison Industries generated a profit of \$401,000 from \$19.6 million in sales in FY 2005.
- 3. Out-of-state sales were approximately \$717,000 in FY 2005, or 3.7% of total sales. While this is a small percentage of total sales, out-of-state sales is a growing market for lowa Prison Industries.
- 4. Thirty states permit Prison Industries to sell out-of-state.

Assumption

Any restriction on product sales has a potential negative fiscal impact on the operations of lowa Prison Industries.

Fiscal Impact

The restriction imposed under HF 2415 may have a negative impact on the long-term financial stability of lowa Prison Industries.
