- 7 twelve and served by local school districts, accredited or

- 11 elementary and secondary school classes and courses. The

This Department prefile bill implements the recommendations of the State Board of Education Technology Advisory Committee. Over the last two years, a multi-stakeholder committee met to review a variety of aspects of educational technology including existing statute.

The committee included recommendations for the updating of those portions of existing statute addressing educational technology. This bill accounts for those recommendations.
