1 An Act providing an appropriation to review state buildings for compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4 5 6

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY -- REVIEW OF STATE 2 BUILDINGS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT. 3 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to 4 the department of public safety for the fiscal year beginning 5 July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007, the following amount, 6 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose 7 designated: To provide for the review and assessment of all buildings 9 and structures owned by the state, or an agency of the state, 10 to ensure that such buildings and structures are compliant 11 with the federal Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990: 12 \$ The state building code commissioner shall consult with the 14 director of the department of administrative services in 15 conducting such review and assessment. 16 The state building code commissioner shall report the 17 results of such assessment to the joint transportation, 18 infrastructure, and capitals appropriations subcommittee and 19 the legislative services agency prior to the convening of the 20 general assembly in 2008. For those buildings and structures 21 that are not compliant, the state building code commissioner, 22 after consulting with the department of administrative 23 services, shall include in the report an estimate of the cost 24 to bring the state's buildings and structures into compliance. 25 **EXPLANATION** This bill appropriates \$50,000 to the department of public 26 27 safety for the review and assessment of all buildings and 28 structures owned by the state, or an agency of the state, to 29 ensure that such buildings and structures are compliant with 30 the federal Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990. 31 state building code commissioner is required to consult with 32 the director of the department of administrative services in 33 conducting the review and assessment.
