1 Section 1. Section 90A.1, Code 2005, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:

3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 1A. "Boxing" or "wrestling" means any 4 kind of boxing, wrestling, or unarmed combat fighting activity 5 that is considered a professional match or activity as set 6 forth in subsection 5.

7 Sec. 2. Section 90A.1, subsection 5, Code 2005, is amended 8 to read as follows:

9 5. "Professional boxing or wrestling match" means a boxing 10 or wrestling or professional unarmed combat fighting contest 11 or exhibition open to the public in this state for which the 12 contestants are paid or awarded a prize for their 13 participation.

14 Sec. 3. Section 90A.1, Code 2005, is amended by adding the 15 following new subsection:

16 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 5A. "Professional unarmed combat 17 fighting" means mixed martial arts fighting, extreme fighting, 18 ultimate fighting, or shoot fighting.

19 Sec. 4. Section 90A.2, subsection 1, Code 2005, is amended 20 to read as follows:

1. A person shall not act as a promoter of a professional boxing or wrestling or professional unarmed combat fighting match, contest, event, or exhibition without first obtaining a license from the commissioner. This subsection shall not sapply to a person distributing a closed-circuit, pay-per-view, or similarly distributed signal to a person acting as a promoter or to a person viewing the signal in a private residence.

29 Sec. 5. Section 90A.2, Code 2005, is amended by adding the 30 following new subsection:

31 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 4. Each application for a professional 32 unarmed combat fighting license presented by a promoter shall 33 be accompanied by a one thousand dollar license fee. Fees 34 collected under this subsection shall be considered repayment 35 receipts and shall be used for payment of expenses to

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1 administer and regulate unarmed combat fighting contests, 2 matches, events, and exhibitions.

3 Sec. 6. Section 90A.3, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2005, are 4 amended to read as follows:

5 1. Each professional boxer <u>and professional unarmed combat</u> 6 <u>fighter</u> residing in Iowa shall register with the commissioner. 7 The registration application shall be in the form prescribed 8 by the commissioner and shall be accompanied by the fee 9 established by rule by the commissioner. <u>The commissioner</u> 10 <u>shall establish by rule a registration fee of not less than</u> 11 <u>one hundred dollars for any unarmed combat fighter seeking to</u> 12 <u>participate in a professional unarmed combat fighting match</u>, 13 <u>contest, event, or exhibition held in Iowa</u>. The <u>registration</u> 14 information required by the commissioner shall include, but is 15 not limited to, the following:

16 a. The boxer's <u>or professional unarmed combat fighter's</u> 17 name and address.

18 b. The boxer's or professional unarmed combat fighter's 19 gender.

20 c. The boxer's or professional unarmed combat fighter's
21 date of birth.

d. The boxer's <u>or professional unarmed combat fighter's</u> social security number or, if a foreign boxer <u>or professional</u> <u>unarmed combat fighter</u>, any similar citizen identification number or professional boxer <u>or professional unarmed combat</u> <u>fighter</u> number from the country of residence of the boxer <u>or</u> <u>professional unarmed combat fighter</u>.

e. The boxer's personal identification number assigned to the boxer by a professional boxing registry certified by the association of boxing commissions if the boxer is registered with a registry. If a professional unarmed combat fighter registering with the commissioner pursuant to this section has been assigned a personal identification number by a professional unarmed combat fighter registry certified by a professional unarmed combat fighter association or commission,

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1 the professional unarmed combat fighter shall submit to the 2 commissioner the identification number assigned to the 3 professional unarmed combat fighter by the registry.

4 f. Two copies of a recent photograph of the boxer or
5 professional unarmed combat fighter.

6 g. An official government-issued photo identification
7 containing the boxer's <u>or professional unarmed combat</u>
8 <u>fighter's</u> photograph and social security number or similar
9 foreign identification number.

10 2. The commissioner shall issue an identification card to 11 a boxer or professional unarmed combat fighter registered 12 pursuant to this chapter. The identification card shall 13 contain a recent photograph, the boxer's or professional 14 unarmed combat fighter's social security number or similar 15 foreign identification number, and a personal identification 16 number assigned to the boxer by a boxing registry or a 17 personal identification number assigned the professional 18 unarmed combat fighter if the professional unarmed combat 19 fighter submitted such a number to the commissioner in 20 accordance with subsection 1, paragraph "e".

Sec. 7. Section 90A.5, subsection 1, paragraphs c through 22 h, Code 2005, are amended to read as follows:

c. A boxer or professional unarmed combat fighter fails to
24 pass a prefight physical examination.

d. A match promoter permits a nonregistered boxer or
26 professional unarmed combat fighter to participate in a
27 professional boxing or professional unarmed combat fighting
28 match.

e. A match promoter permits a person whose license,
registration, or authority, issued pursuant to this chapter,
is under suspension to participate in a boxing <u>or professional</u>
<u>unarmed combat fighting</u> event.

f. A match promoter, or professional boxer, or
<u>professional unarmed combat fighter</u> is under suspension by any
other state boxing or professional unarmed combat fighting

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1 regulatory organization.

g. A match promoter, or professional boxer, or
3 professional unarmed combat fighter is under suspension in any
4 state.

h. A match promoter, professional boxer, professional
<u>unarmed combat fighter</u>, or participant is in violation of
7 rules adopted pursuant to section 90A.7.

8 Sec. 8. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 90A.13 ATTENDANCE AGE REQUIREMENTS. 9 Attendance at any professional boxing or wrestling match is 10 limited to individuals eighteen years of age or older. 11 However, if liquor or beer is sold or served on the premises 12 in which the match is held, attendance at any professional 13 boxing or wrestling match is limited to individuals twenty-one 14 years of age or older.

15 Sec. 9. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 90A.14 AMATEUR UNARMED COMBAT 16 FIGHTING PROHIBITED -- PENALTY.

17 1. Amateur unarmed combat fighting contests, matches,
 18 events, or exhibitions are prohibited in this state.

19 2. A person who acts as an amateur unarmed combat fighting 20 match promoter in violation of this section is subject to a 21 civil penalty of twenty thousand dollars per violation.

22 3. As used in this section:

a. "Amateur unarmed combat fighting" means mixed martial
arts activities which include shoot fighting, extreme
fighting, and ultimate fighting.

b. "Amateur unarmed combat fighting promoter" means a
person or business that does at least one of the following:
(1) Organizes, holds, advertises, or otherwise conducts an
amateur unarmed combat fighting match.

30 (2) Charges admission for the viewing of an amateur
 31 unarmed combat fighting match received through a closed 32 circuit, pay-per-view, or similarly distributed signal.
 33 EXPLANATION

This bill defines "boxing" or "wrestling", for purposes of Socie chapter 90A, which regulates boxing and wrestling, as any

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1	kind of boxing, wrestling, or unarmed combat fighting activity
	that is considered a professional match or activity. The bill
	places professional unarmed combat fighting under the
	regulatory authority of the labor commissioner.
5	The bill defines "professional unarmed combat fighting" as
6	mixed martial arts fighting, extreme fighting, ultimate
7	fighting, or shoot fighting. The bill requires a person who
8	promotes such fighting to obtain a license from the
9	commissioner and to pay a \$1,000 licensing fee. Professional
10	unarmed combatants must register with the commissioner and pay
11	a registration fee of not less than \$100.
12	Persons who attend a professional boxing or wrestling match
	must be 18 years or older, or 21 years or older if liquor or
	beer is sold or served on the match premises.

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Section 1. Section 90A.1, Code 2005, is amended by adding 1 2 the following new subsection:

3 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. "Boxing" or "wrestling" means the 4 traditional form of boxing or wrestling and shall not include 5 fight contests or exhibitions commonly known as ultimate or 6 extreme fighting, as determined by the commissioner. 7

EXPLANATION

This bill defines "boxing" or "wrestling", for purposes of 8 9 Code chapter 90A, which regulates boxing and wrestling, as the 10 traditional forms of these sports. The bill also excludes 11 from the definition fight contests or exhibitions commonly 12 known as ultimate or extreme fighting, as determined by the 13 labor commissioner, therefore excluding these contests or 14 exhibitions from the labor commissioner's regulation.

LSB #5399DP – An Act excluding ultimate and extreme fighting from regulation as boxing or wrestling contests.

The Labor Commissioner has enforcement authority pursuant to Iowa Code 90A to issue licenses for "boxing" and "wrestling" matches. This bill defines "boxing" and "wrestling" as the traditional forms of those sports, and deletes from that definition fight contests or exhibitions commonly known as "extreme" or "ultimate" fighting, as determined by the Commissioner.

Extreme or ultimate fighting events involve far less traditional rules and safeguards than traditional boxing and wrestling and are viewed as posing greater liability to the State for potential injuries. The Attorney General's Office agreed to this definition change.
