## A BILL FOR

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An Act relating to teacher and administrator quality, including the student achievement and teacher quality program, school social workers' participation in the program, a new teacher development academy and new teacher fellows, and a new administrator quality program, and making appropriations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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- Section 1. Section 256.9, Code 2005, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 53. Develop core knowledge and skill
- 4 criteria, based upon the Iowa standards for school leaders,
- 5 for mentoring and induction, evaluation, and administrator
- 6 career development purposes pursuant to chapter 284A. The
- 7 criteria shall further define the characteristics of quality
- 8 administrators as established by the Iowa standards for school
- 9 leaders established in section 284A.3.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 272.9A, Code 2005, is amended by adding
- 11 the following new unnumbered paragraph:
- 12 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The board shall include in its
- 13 administrator licensure renewal requirements, adopted pursuant
- 14 to section 272.2, subsection 1, an option under which
- 15 compliance with individual administrator career development
- 16 plans may constitute successful completion of a professional
- 17 development program.
- 18 Sec. 3. Section 284.1, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2005,
- 19 is amended to read as follows:
- 20 A student achievement and teacher quality program is
- 21 established to promote high student achievement. The program
- 22 shall consist of the following four five major elements:
- Sec. 4. Section 284.1, subsection 3, Code 2005, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 3. Professional development, including teacher development
- 26 academies, designed to directly support best teaching
- 27 practices.
- Sec. 5. Section 284.1, Code 2005, is amended by adding the
- 29 following new subsection:
- 30 NEW SUBSECTION. 3A. Evaluation of teachers against the
- 31 Iowa teaching standards.
- 32 Sec. 6. Section 284.2, subsection 1, Code 2005, is amended
- 33 to read as follows:
- 34 1. "Beginning teacher" means an individual serving under
- 35 an initial or intern license, issued by the board of

- 1 educational examiners under chapter 2727-who-is-assuming-a
- 2 position-as-a-classroom-teacher. For purposes of the
- 3 beginning teacher mentoring and induction program created
- 4 pursuant to section 284.5, "beginning teacher" also includes
- 5 preschool teachers who are licensed by the board of
- 6 educational examiners under chapter 272 and are employed by a
- 7 school district or area education agency.
- 8 Sec. 7. Section 284.2, subsection 2, Code 2005, is amended
- 9 by striking the subsection.
- 10 Sec. 8. Section 284.2, subsections 8 and 12, Code 2005,
- 11 are amended to read as follows:
- 12 8. "Mentor" means an individual employed by a school
- 13 district or area education agency as a classroom teacher or a
- 14 retired teacher who holds a valid license issued under chapter
- 15 272. The individual must have a record of four years of
- 16 successful teaching practice, must be employed on a
- 17 nonprobationary basis, and must demonstrate professional
- 18 commitment to both the improvement of teaching and learning
- 19 and the development of beginning teachers.
- 20 12. "Teacher" means an individual holding a practitioner's
- 21 license issued under chapter 272, who is employed in a
- 22 nonadministrative position as a teacher, librarian, media
- 23 specialist, preschool teacher, or counselor by a school
- 24 district or area education agency pursuant to a contract
- 25 issued by a board of directors under section 279.13.
- 26 "Teacher" also means a school social worker licensed under
- 27 chapter 154C if the social worker is employed in a
- 28 nonadministrative position by a school district or area
- 29 education agency pursuant to a contract issued by a board of
- 30 directors under section 279.13. A teacher may be employed in
- 31 both an administrative and a nonadministrative position by a
- 32 board of directors and shall be considered a part-time teacher
- 33 for the portion of time that the teacher is employed in a
- 34 nonadministrative position. "Teacher" includes a licensed
- 35 individual employed on a less than full-time basis by a school

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- 1 district through a contract between the school district and an
- 2 institution of higher education with a practitioner
- 3 preparation program in which the licensed teacher is enrolled.
- 4 Sec. 9. Section 284.5, subsections 1 and 3, Code 2005, are
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 l. A beginning teacher mentoring and induction program is
- 7 created to promote excellence in teaching, enhance student
- 8 achievement, build a supportive environment within school
- 9 districts and area education agencies, increase the retention
- 10 of promising beginning teachers, and promote the personal and
- ll professional well-being of classroom teachers.
- 12 3. Each school district and area education agency shall
- 13 provide a beginning teacher mentoring and induction program
- 14 for all classroom teachers who are beginning teachers, and

- 16 and an area education agency shall be eligible to receive
- 17 moneys under section 284.13, subsection 1, paragraph "c", for
- 18 purposes of implementing a beginning teacher mentoring and
- 19 induction program in accordance with this section.
- Sec. 10. Section 284.6, Code 2005, is amended by adding

- 22 NEW SUBSECTION. 7. The department shall establish teacher
- 23 development academies for the training of school-based teams
- 24 of teachers. Each academy shall include a multiday summer
- 25 institute and follow-up training and coaching during the

- 27 receive stipends up to the equivalent of ten contract days for
- 28 activities offered outside of regular contract hours and

- 10 develop, with input from key stakeholders, a process for
- 11 selecting teacher fellow candidates and credentialing of
- 12 teacher fellows in accordance with section 284.7, subsection
- 13 l, paragraph "c". The process shall utilize a panel of
- 14 individuals who are recognized for their experience in
- 15 providing quality professional development and represent
- 16 various stakeholder groups within the educational community.

- 35 administrator and used to determine whether the

- 1 administrator's practice meets school district expectations
- 2 and the Iowa standards for school leaders.
- 3 7. "School board" means the board of directors of a school
- 4 district or a collaboration of boards of directors of school
- 5 districts.
- 6 8. "State board" means the state board of education.
- 7 Sec. 27. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 284A.3 IOWA STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL
- 8 LEADERS.
- 9 1. For purposes of this chapter and for developing
- 10 evaluation criteria under section 279.23A, the Iowa standards
- ll for school leaders describe a school administrator as an
- 12 educational leader who promotes the success of all students by
- 13 doing the following:
- 14 a. Facilitating the development, articulation,
- 15 implementation, and stewardship of a vision of learning that
- 16 is shared and supported by the school community.

- 1 the Iowa standards for school leaders and the criteria for the
- 2 standards developed by the department in accordance with
- 3 section 256.9, subsection 53. A local school board may
- 4 establish additional administrator standards and criteria. A
- 5 local school board and its administrators may negotiate
- 6 evaluation and grievance procedures for the administrators
- 7 that are not in conflict with this chapter.

- 33 induction program for all new administrators.

- 3 mentor selection process, describe supports for new
- 4 administrators, describe program organizational and

- 9 district or the area education agency, prior to the new
- 10 administrator's participation in a mentoring and induction
- 11 program, of the criteria upon which the administrator shall be
- 12 evaluated and of the evaluation process utilized by the school
- 13 district or area education agency.
- 14 Sec. 30. NEW SECTION. 284A.6 ADMINISTRATOR CAREER
- 15 DEVELOPMENT.
- 16 1. Each school district shall provide professional growth
- 17 programming for individuals employed in administrative
- 18 positions at the school district by the school district or
- 19 area education agency as deemed appropriate by the board of
- 20 directors of the school district or the area education agency
- 21 employing the administrator. School districts may collaborate
- 22 with other educational stakeholders including other school
- 23 districts, area education agencies, professional
- 24 organizations, higher education institutions, and private
- 25 providers, in the provision of professional development for
- 26 school district administrators. Professional development
- 27 programming for school district administrators may include
- 28 supports that meet the career development needs of individual

- 3 standards for school leaders, and the student achievement
- 4 goals of the attendance center and the school district as
- 5 outlined in the comprehensive school improvement plan.
- 6 3. The administrator's evaluator shall annually meet with
- 7 the administrator to review the administrator's progress in
- 8 meeting career development goals in the plan and to review
- 9 collaborative work with other staff on student achievement
- 10 goals and to modify as necessary the administrator's
- ll individual plan to reflect the individual administrator's and
- 12 the school district's needs and the individual's progress in
- 13 meeting the goals in the plan. The administrator shall
- 14 present to the evaluator evidence of progress. The
- 15 administrator's supervisor and the evaluator shall review,
- 16 modify, accept, or reject modifications made to the
- 17 administrator's individual plan.
- 18 Sec. 31. NEW SECTION. 284A.7 PERFORMANCE REVIEW
- 19 REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMINISTRATORS.
- 20 A school district shall review an administrator's
- 21 performance annually for purposes of assisting the
- 22 administrator in making continuous improvement, documenting
- 23 continued competence in the Iowa standards for school leaders,
- 24 or to determine whether the administrator's practice meets
- 25 school district expectations. The performance review shall
- 26 include, at a minimum, an assessment of the administrator's
- 27 progress toward meeting the Iowa standards for school leaders
- 28 and the implementation of the administrator's individual
- 29 career development plan, including supporting documentation or
- 30 materials aligned to the Iowa standards for school leaders and
- 31 the administrator's individual career development plan.
- 32 Sec. 32. NEW SECTION. 284A.8 STATE PROGRAM
- 33 APPROPRIATION.
- 34 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
- 35 state to the department of education for the fiscal year

- 1 beginning July 1, 2005, and each succeeding fiscal year, the
- 2 sum of two hundred forty-five thousand dollars for purposes of
- 3 the new administrator mentoring and induction program. From
- 4 the funds appropriated, the department shall allocate to each
- 5 school district one thousand five hundred dollars per new
- 6 administrator participating in the new administrator mentoring
- 7 and induction program. If the funds appropriated for the
- 8 program are insufficient to pay school districts as provided
- 9 in this subsection, the department shall prorate the amount
- 10 distributed to school districts based upon the amount
- ll appropriated. Moneys received by a school district pursuant
- 12 to this subsection shall be expended to implement the new
- 13 administrator mentoring program.
- 14 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, any moneys remaining
- 15 unobligated or unexpended from the moneys appropriated under
- 16 subsection 1 shall not revert, but shall remain available in
- 17 the succeeding fiscal year for expenditure for the purposes
- 18 designated. The provisions of section 8.39 shall not apply to
- 19 the funds appropriated pursuant to this section.
- 20 Sec. 33. Section 284.9, Code 2005, is repealed.
- 21 Sec. 34. STATE MANDATE FUNDING SPECIFIED. In accordance
- 22 with section 25B.2, subsection 3, the state cost of requiring
- 23 compliance with any state mandate included in this Act shall
- 24 be paid by a school district from state school foundation aid
- 25 received by the school district under section 257.16 and
- 26 moneys appropriated in this Act. This specification of the
- 27 payment of the state cost shall be deemed to meet all the
- 28 state funding-related requirements of section 25B.2,
- 29 subsection 3, and no additional state funding shall be
- 30 necessary for the full implementation of this Act by and
- 31 enforcement of this Act against all affected school districts.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 This bill makes changes to the student achievement and
- 34 teacher quality program, establishes an administrator quality
- 35 program, sets forth Iowa standards for school leaders, and

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- 1 provides for an annual appropriation of \$245,000 to the
- 2 department of education for implementation of a new
- 3 administrator mentoring and induction program.
- 4 The bill adds new elements to the student achievement and
- 5 teacher quality program, including teacher development
- 6 programs and evaluation of teachers against the Iowa teaching
- 7 standards. The bill also adds social workers to the
- 8 definition of "teacher" under the program, which means social
- 9 workers will participate in the standards, performance
- 10 reviews, career development planning, career path
- 11 compensation, and the new teacher development programs and
- 12 evaluation requirements.
- 13 TEACHER DEVELOPMENT ACADEMIES AND TEACHER FELLOWS. The
- 14 bill directs the department of education to establish teacher
- 15 development academies, including a multiday summer institute
- 16 and follow-up training and coaching during the school year,
- 17 for school-based teams of teachers. Teachers attending the
- 18 academy shall receive stipends equivalent to up to 10 contract
- 19 days. School districts shall be reimbursed for team expenses.
- 20 Area education agency personnel may participate but shall not
- 21 be eligible for stipends or reimbursement of expenses.
- 22 Teachers who successfully complete academy training may apply
- 23 for a training program to become a teacher fellow.
- 24 School districts participating in the program must pay an
- 25 additional \$5,000 annually to a teacher who qualifies for the
- 26 five-year renewable term of the teacher fellow. In order to
- 27 maintain the teacher fellow credential, the teacher fellow
- 28 shall annually serve as a trainer.
- 29 TEACHER ACHIEVEMENT LEVELS AND REFERENCES ELIMINATED. The
- 30 bill strikes references to "classroom teacher", "career II
- 31 teacher", and "advanced teacher" from the chapter establishing
- 32 the student achievement and teacher quality program, and
- 33 repeals the Code section that provides for a review panel for
- 34 career II teachers seeking advancement to the advanced teacher
- 35 level. The bill eliminates expired appropriation language

- 1 that refers to the pilot program for team-based variable pay.
- 2 IOWA TEACHER CAREER PATH. The bill expands the Iowa
- 3 teacher career path to include beginning teachers who hold an
- 4 intern teacher license. The bill also delays until July 1,
- 5 2006, a requirement that the director of the department of
- 6 education develop and implement an evaluator training
- 7 certification renewal program.
- 8 STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND TEACHER QUALITY PROGRAM
- 9 APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes appropriations and allocations
- 10 to the department of education to continue providing funding
- 11 to school districts and area education agencies for salaries
- 12 and career development purposes, to continue funding national
- 13 board certification awards, to fund a support program for
- 14 national board certification applicants, to continue funding
- 15 beginning teacher mentoring and induction programs, to
- 16 continue funding evaluator training, to fund teacher career
- 17 development programs, and to establish teacher development
- 18 academies and pay stipends to teacher fellows.
- 19 ADMINISTRATOR QUALITY PROGRAM. The administrator quality
- 20 program established by the bill is designed to function much
- 21 like the teacher quality, career development, and evaluation
- 22 provisions of the student achievement and teacher quality
- 23 program. The program consists of three components: mentoring
- 24 and induction programs, professional development designed to
- 25 directly support best practices for leadership, and evaluation
- 26 of administrators against the Iowa standards for school
- 27 leaders.
- 28 The bill also sets forth the Iowa standards for school
- 29 leaders and directs the state board of education to develop
- 30 core knowledge and skill criteria, based upon the standards,
- 31 for mentoring and induction, evaluation, and administrator
- 32 career development purposes.
- 33 The bill requires each school board to, by July 1, 2006,
- 34 conduct annual evaluations that assess administrators, at a
- 35 minimum, against the Iowa standards for school leaders and the

- 1 criteria for the standards developed by the department. A
- 2 local school board and its administrators may negotiate
- 3 additional evaluation and grievance procedures. The bill also
- 4 requires school districts to implement an administrator
- 5 mentoring and induction program, adopt individual career
- 6 development plans for administrators, and adopt an
- 7 administrator evaluation plan that requires an annual
- 8 performance review of administrators.
- 9 NEW ADMINISTRATOR MENTORING AND INDUCTION. The department
- 10 of education is directed to provide a new administrator
- 11 mentoring and induction program for all new administrators.
- 12 The program shall, at a minimum, provide for one year of
- 13 programming.
- 14 Each school district must provide for the professional
- 15 growth programming for individuals employed in an
- 16 administrative position at the school district.
- 17 Each school district administrator must develop an
- 18 individual career development plan. The administrator's
- 19 evaluator shall annually meet with the administrator to review
- 20 progress in meeting the goals in the administrator's
- 21 individual plan.
- 22 A school district shall review an administrator's
- 23 performance annually for purposes of assisting the
- 24 administrator in making continuous improvement, documenting
- 25 continued competence in the Iowa standards for school leaders,
- 26 or to determine whether the administrator's practice meets
- 27 school district expectations.
- 28 The bill directs the board of educational examiners to
- 29 include in its administrator licensure renewal requirements an
- 30 option that allows credit for administrators' individual
- 31 career development plans.
- 32 ADMINISTRATOR QUALITY PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS. The bill
- 33 appropriates \$245,000 to the department of education for
- 34 purposes of the new administrator mentoring and induction
- 35 program, and allocates to each school district \$1,500 per new

1 administrator participating in the program.

2 The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code

3 section 25B.3. The bill requires that the state cost of any

4 state mandate included in the bill be paid by a school

5 district from state school foundation aid received by the

6 school district under Code section 257.16 and moneys

7 appropriated in the bill. The specification is deemed to

8 constitute state compliance with any state mandate funding-

9 related requirements of Code section 25B.2. The inclusion of

10 this specification is intended to reinstate the requirement of

11 political subdivisions to comply with any state mandates

12 included in the bill.

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
