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1 Section 1. Section 455F.8A, Code 2005, is amended by

8 EXPLANATION

9 This bill relates to the collection, transportation, and
10 disposal of household hazardous waste.

11 The bill provides that a private agency which provides for
12 the collection and disposal of household hazardous waste as
13 part of an approved comprehensive plan may use a portion of
14 solid waste tonnage fees for the establishment of permanent
15 household hazardous waste collection sites.

16 Currently, 9.5 percent of the tonnage fees deposited in the
17 solid waste account of the groundwater protection fund are
18 used by the department to establish permanent household
19 hazardous waste collection sites. The bill provides that, for
20 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, the percentage
21 decreases to 6.5 percent and for the fiscal period beginning
22 July 1, 2007, and every fiscal year thereafter, the percentage
23 decreases to 3 percent. The bill provides that any moneys
24 remaining unexpended at the end of a fiscal year shall be used
25 for payment of transportation costs related to household
26 hazardous waste collection programs.

27 Currently, 3 percent of the tonnage fees deposited in the
28 solid waste account of the groundwater protection fund are
29 used by the department for payment of transportation costs
30 related to household hazardous waste collection programs. The
31 bill provides that, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
32 2006, the percentage increases to 6.5 percent and for the
33 fiscal period beginning July 1, 2007, and every fiscal year
34 thereafter, the percentage increases to 9.5 percent.

Description

House File 602 changes the percentage allocation of the funds as specified in Section 455E.11, Code of Iowa, paid into the Solid Waste Account in the Groundwater Protection Fund for permanent household hazardous waste collection sites and for transportation of household hazardous waste.

Background

The Groundwater Protection Fund was created by the 1987 Legislature and is administered by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The Fund has four accounts that include: Solid Waste, Agriculture Management, Household Hazardous Waste, and Storage Tank Management. The Bill changes the percentage allocations in the Solid Waste Account for programs that collect and dispose household hazardous waste.

Assumptions

1. The base tonnage fee paid by landfills is \$4.25 per ton. Some landfills pay less as they meet garbage diversion goals and some landfills pay more due to penalties. The average amount retained by a landfill is \$1.20, with \$3.05 remitted to the DNR.
2. The DNR uses \$1.55 of the \$3.05 for Department operations and program support.
3. From the \$1.55, \$0.15 (or 9.5%) is allocated for grants to establish regional collection center sites for household hazardous waste. The current fee collected for this program is \$368,000 per year.
4. From the \$1.55, \$0.05 (or 3.0%) is allocated for reimbursement of the costs to transport and dispose household hazardous waste. The current fee collected for this program is \$123,000 per year.
5. The current number of tons subject to a tonnage fee is 2.5 million.
6. The following table summarizes the changes in revenue for Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) establishment grants and for the transportation of HHW:

Fiscal Impact

The fiscal impact for HF 602 is a decrease in revenue of \$126,000 for FY 2007 and \$252,000 for FY 2008 for grants to establish household hazardous waste collection sites and an increase of \$132,000 for FY 2007 and \$266,000 for FY 2008 for transportation costs of hazardous waste.

(e) Three For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, three percent to the department for payment of transportation costs related to household hazardous waste collection programs. Beginning July 1, 2006, six and one-quarter percent to the department for payment of transportation costs related to household hazardous waste collection programs. Beginning July 1, 2007, nine and one-half percent to the department for payment of transportation costs related to household hazardous waste collection programs.
