- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 163.14A CERTIFICATE OF DRUG 2 TREATMENT.
- 3 A person shall not move livestock into this state from a
- 4 foreign country if the livestock has been treated with any
- 5 drug required to be approved by the United States food and
- 6 drug administration for treating livestock in this country,
- 7 and the United States food and drug administration has not
- 8 approved that drug. The person moving livestock into this
- 9 state from a foreign country shall keep a certificate of
- 10 treatment stating that the livestock has not been treated with
- 11 the drug. The certificate shall be signed by the livestock's
- 12 owner or agent, which may be a veterinarian responsible for
- 13 the health of the livestock. A copy of the certificate shall
- 14 be attached to the waybill accompanying a shipment or as part
- 15 of the standard form of a transportation certificate or
- 16 another shipping document as provided in section 172B.3.
- 17 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 163.14B CERTIFICATE FOR IMPORTATION
- 18 OF FEMALE CATTLE.
- 19 1. A person shall not move female cattle into this state
- 20 from a foreign country, if the cattle are thirty months of age
- 21 or older.
- 22 2. The department may require that a person moving female
- 23 cattle into this state from a foreign country keep a
- 24 certificate which states the age of the female cattle. The
- 25 department may require that the certificate be signed by the
- 26 female cattle's owner or agent, which may be a veterinarian
- 27 responsible for the health of the cattle. A copy of the
- 28 certificate shall be attached to the waybill accompanying a
- 29 shipment or as part of a standard form of a transportation
- 30 certificate or another document as provided in section 172B.3.
- 31 EXPLANATION
- 32 LIVESTOCK MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS BASED ON DRUG TREATMENTS.
- 33 The United States food and drug administration requires that
- 34 animal drug manufacturers show that each new animal drug
- 35 (e.g., a therapeutic, prophylactic, or growth promoter) is

1 safe and effective before it is approved for marketing in the 2 country (see 21 U.S.C. ch. 9). This bill amends Code chapter

3 163 which, in part, provides for the inspection of livestock

4 including imported livestock, and requires that shipments of

5 livestock be accompanied by a certificate of inspection. The

6 bill is modeled on those provisions.

7 The bill provides that a person cannot move livestock into

8 this state from a foreign country if the livestock has been

9 treated with any drug required to be approved by the United

10 States food and drug administration for treating livestock in

11 this country, and the United States food and drug

12 administration has not approved that drug. The bill requires

13 that a person moving the livestock keep a certificate of

14 treatment stating that the livestock has not been treated with

15 the drug. The certificate must be signed by the livestock's

16 owner or agent. In addition, a copy of the certificate must

17 be attached to the waybill accompanying the shipment or as

18 part of the standard form of a transportation certificate or

19 another shipping document as approved by the department of

20 agriculture and land stewardship.

21 FEMALE CATTLE MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS. The bill prohibits a

22 person from moving female cattle into this state from a

23 foreign country if the cattle are 30 months of age or older.

24 The department of agriculture and land stewardship may require

25 a person moving the cattle to keep a certificate which states

26 the age of the female cattle. The department may require that

27 the same procedures which apply to preparing and keeping a

28 certificate of drug treatment apply to this certificate.

29 PENALTY MADE APPLICABLE. Code section 163.61 provides that

30 the department must establish civil penalties for violations

31 of the Code chapter's provisions. In general, a person

32 violating a provision of the chapter is subject to a civil

33 penalty of at least \$100 but not more than \$1,000. In the

34 case of a continuing violation, each day of the continuing

35 violation is a separate violation. However, a person cannot
