- 22 This bill makes it unlawful to sell, own, possess, or use a
- 23 traffic signal preemption device except in connection with the
- 24 use of an authorized emergency vehicle or as authorized by the
- 25 jurisdiction that owns and operates an official traffic
- 26 control signal. The bill defines "traffic signal preemption
- 27 device" as a device that can change a traffic control signal
- 28 to green out of sequence.
- The penalty for a violation is a simple misdemeanor, which
- 30 is punishable by a fine of up to \$500 or 30 days'
- 31 imprisonment, or both. The bill specifies that the penalty
- 32 shall include, at a minimum, a fine of \$250. In addition, if
- 33 the violation is for unauthorized use of a traffic signal
- 34 preemption device, the person may also be required to perform
- 35 community service.

PROHIBITING THE UNAUTHORIZED SALE, OWNERSHIP, POSSESSION,
OR USE OF TRAFFIC SIGNAL PREEMPTION DEVICES AND PROVIDING
A PENALTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 321.260, Code 2005, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 3. a. A person shall not sell, own, possess, or use a traffic signal preemption device except as permitted in connection with the lawful operation of an authorized emergency vehicle as defined in section 321.1 or as otherwise authorized by the jurisdiction owning and operating an official traffic control signal. A person who is convicted of the unauthorized sale, ownership, possession, or use of a traffic signal preemption device is guilty of a simple misdemeanor. In addition to any other penalties, the punishment imposed for a violation under this subsection shall include assessment of a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars, and if the violation involves the unauthorized use of a traffic signal preemption device, the person may also be required to complete community service.

b. For purposes of this subsection, "traffic signal preemption device" means a device that, when activated, is House File 717, p. 2

capable of changing an official traffic control signal to green out of sequence.
