- 1 Section 1. Section 321.285, subsection 6, Code 2005, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 6. a. Notwithstanding any other speed restrictions, the
- 4 speed limit for all vehicular traffic on fully controlled-
- 5 access, divided, multilaned highways including-the-national
- 6 system-of-interstate-highways is sixty-five miles per hour.
- 7 However, the speed limit for all vehicular traffic on highways
- 8 that are part of the interstate road system, as defined in
- 9 section 306.3, is seventy miles per hour. The department may
- 10 establish a speed limit of sixty-five miles per hour on
- 11 certain divided, multilaned highways not otherwise described
- 12 in this paragraph.

- 23 Act, to replace existing Iowa state patrol vehicles used by
- 24 canine handlers, when those vehicles are due for replacement,

- 27 EXPLANATION
- 28 This bill increases the speed limit on interstate highways
- 29 from 65 to 70 miles per hour for all vehicles. The speed
- 30 limit on all other fully controlled access, divided,
- 31 multilaned highways remains at 65 miles per hour, and the
- 32 state department of transportation may continue to establish a
- 33 65-mile-per-hour speed limit on certain other divided,
- 34 multilaned highways. The bill broadens the authority of the
- 35 department to establish a lower speed limit on any portion of

1 a divided, multilaned highway, including interstates. 2 department may exercise this authority on its own motion or in 3 response to a recommendation of a metropolitan or regional 4 planning commission or council of governments. The bill increases fines for speeding violations committed 6 in speed zones greater than 55 miles per hour. The fines are 7 increased from \$10 to \$20 for speed not more than five miles 8 per hour over the limit; from \$20 to \$40 for more than five 9 but not more than 10 miles per hour over the limit; from \$40 10 to \$60 for more than 10 but not more than 15 miles per hour 11 over the limit; from \$60 to \$80 for more than 15 but not more 12 than 20 miles per hour over the limit; and from \$60 to \$90 13 plus \$5 for each mile per hour of excessive speed over 20 14 miles per hour over the limit. For the fiscal year beginning 15 July 1, 2005, and for the three succeeding fiscal years, an 16 amount estimated to be the portion of speeding fines collected 17 from the increased fines is to be allocated to the state 18 patrol vehicle depreciation account. The moneys are 19 appropriated to the department of public safety to be used to 20 purchase vehicles for the Iowa state patrol. The department 21 of public safety is directed to use a portion of those vehicle 22 depreciation funds to replace state patrol vehicles used by 23 canine handlers with multipurpose vehicles equipped for canine 24 transport when the existing vehicles are due for replacement. The bill provides for an increase in the fee charged by the 26 clerk of the district court for the filing and docketing of a 27 complaint or information for a simple misdemeanor from \$17 to The bill also increases the court costs for a scheduled 29 violation from \$17 to \$30. The state court administrator is 30 directed to allocate \$7 million annually, from fines and fees 31 received from the district courts, to the judicial branch to 32 be used for salaries, receipt and disbursement of child 33 support payments, reimbursement of auditor expenses, 34 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes.
