1 Section 1. Section 423.3, Code 2005, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection: 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 85. a. The sales price from the sale of 4 coins, currency, or bullion. 5 b. For purposes of this subsection: 6 (1) "Bullion" means bars, ingots, or commemorative 7 medallions of gold, silver, platinum, palladium, or a 8 combination of these where the value of the metal depends on 9 its content and not the form. (2) "Coins" or "currency" means a coin or currency made of 10 ll gold, silver, or other metal or paper which is or has been 12 used as legal tender. 13 EXPLANATION 14 This bill exempts the sales price from the sale of coins, 15 currency, or bullion from the sales and use taxes. "Coins" 16 and "currency" are defined to include metal or paper that is 17 or was used as legal tender. #### **Description**

House File 844 provides a sales tax exemption on the purchase of coins, currency, and bullion sold to retail customers in Iowa. The change is effective July 1, 2005.

#### **Assumptions**

- 1. Iowa sales currently subject to the State and local sales tax is a minimum of \$7.3 million per year, based on limited information pertaining to:
  - a. American Eagle gold bullion set sales.
  - b. Sales at Iowa jewelry stores dealing in rare coins.
  - c. Sales of rare coins sold at Iowa pawn shops.
- 2. The Sate sales tax rate is 5.0%, and the State average local option tax rate is 1.2%.

#### Fiscal Impact

The coin, currency, and bullion sales tax exemption contained in HF 844 will reduce net General Fund revenue by a minimum of \$365,000 in FY 2006, and that minimum will grow by 3.0% per year.

The exemption will also reduce local option sales tax revenue by a minimum of \$88,000 per year.
