3	A Resolution requesting Iowa's congressional
4	delegation to work to secure adequate funding for

7	WHEREAS, President George W. Bush signed into law
8	the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) on January
9	8, 2002; and
10	WHEREAS, the goals of the NCLB legislation are
11	laudable and Iowans embrace the conviction that all
12	children should have an equal opportunity to obtain a
13	high-quality education; and
14	WHEREAS, Iowa's commitment to providing all of its
15	children with a high-quality education is evidenced by
16	the fact that nearly 90 percent of Iowa's schools
17	score above the national median on nationally
18	standardized tests; and
19	WHEREAS, this commitment begins at the local level
20	with school districts and schools setting challenging
21	local academic standards and continues with the
22	state's dedication to assisting local schools through
23	the Iowa Early Intervention Program enacted in 1999
24	and the Student Achievement and Teacher Quality
25	Program enacted in 2001; and
26	WHEREAS, federal funding for the NCLB represents
27	approximately 4.1 percent of Iowa's total school
28	district funding for education utilized in a school
29	year; and
30	WHEREAS, state revenues are rebounding, but budget

1 pressures threaten to overwhelm them, according to an

- 2 article published in February 2005 by the National
- 3 Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL); and
- 4 WHEREAS, the federal government has neglected to
- 5 provide funding for the NCLB's mandated requirements
- 6 related to supplementary services, transportation
- 7 costs associated with moving students from buildings
- 8 in need of assistance to buildings making annual
- 9 progress, additional data collection, and professional
- 10 development for teachers in schools determined to be
- 11 in need of assistance; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the NCLB requirements create not only
- 13 another level of mandates lacking the resources to
- 14 bring about the level of success required, but could
- 15 actually result in a shift of vital instructional
- 16 dollars for NCLB purposes that are unlikely to enhance
- 17 student achievement or teacher quality; NOW THEREFORE,
- 18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,
- 19 That the Iowa House of Representatives requests Iowa's
- 20 elected representatives in the United States Congress,
- 21 in particular Senator Chuck Grassley, Chair of the
- 22 Committee on Finance, and Representative Jim Nussle,
- 23 Chair of the House Budget Committee, to support, work
- 24 to pass, and vote for adequate funding for mandates
- 25 required under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this
- 27 Resolution be sent to the members of Iowa's
- 28 congressional delegation.
