3	A Resolution requesting the Legislative Council to
4	establish an interim committee to conduct a study of
5	issues related to competition in rural telephone
6	exchanges.
7	WHEREAS, during the 2005 Legislative Session, the
8	General Assembly passed and the Governor signed a bill
9	deregulating most telephone rates in the state of
10	Iowa; and
11	WHEREAS, on December 23, 2004, the Iowa Utilities
12	Board deregulated local rates in the following rural
13	exchanges: Laurens, Mapleton, Spencer, Storm Lake,
14	Whiting, Armstrong, Coon Rapids, Delmar, Forest City,
15	Harlan, Lowden, Oxford, Oxford Junction, Primghar,
16	Saint Ansgar, Solon, Stacyville, Stanwood, and Tiffin;
17	and
18	WHEREAS, on December 4, 2005, the Iowa Utilities
19	Board deregulated the single line flat-rates in the
20	following rural exchanges: Alta, Belle Plaine,
21	Bennett, Cambridge, Carter Lake, Greene, Grundy
22	Center, Guthrie Center, Hartley, Manning, Marble Rock,
23	Marengo, Onawa, Orange City, Osage, Oyens, Paullina,
24	Reinbeck, Slater, and Wapello; and
25	WHEREAS, the Iowa Utilities Board, in the order
26	deregulating the rates in these areas, stated that it
27	intended to monitor the rates in the deregulated areas
28	and would act appropriately for any attempt by one
29	provider to determine or control prices; and
30	WHEREAS, a petition filed with the Iowa Utilities

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- 1 Board specifically alleged that a company offering
- 2 local exchange service was engaging in pricing service
- 3 far below prices charged in regulated areas and was
- 4 improperly subsidizing deregulated services; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Iowa Utilities Board dismissed the
- 6 complaint, stating it lacked jurisdiction because the
- 7 exchanges had been deregulated; and
- 8 WHEREAS, price predation is harmful to consumer
- 9 choice and to the ability of rural Iowans to receive
- 10 quality telecommunications services at a reasonable
- ll price in the long run; and
- 12 WHEREAS, it should be determined whether an
- 13 affordable forum exists for small rural independent
- 14 telephone utilities to challenge price predation; and
- WHEREAS, it should be determined whether the
- 16 deregulation of rural telephone exchange services is
- 17 leading to price predation; NOW THEREFORE,
- 18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 19 That the Legislative Council is requested to create an
- 20 interim committee to study the issues related to
- 21 competition in rural telephone exchanges that have
- 22 been deregulated since December 23, 2004, including
- 23 any issue raised but not resolved in complaints made
- 24 to the Iowa Utilities Board regarding alleged price
- 25 predation in rural exchanges described in this
- 26 Resolution; and
- 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the interim committee
- 28 should be directed to submit its findings to the
- 29 Governor and the General Assembly, which findings may
- 30 include recommendations for legislation to address

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1 predatory pricing and other anticompetitive behavior.
