3	A Resolution honoring the city of Eddyville on its
4	165th anniversary.
5	WHEREAS, the city of Eddyville is named after its
6	founder, Jabish P. Eddy, and is located on the Des
7	Moines River, at the junction of Wapello, Mahaska, and
8	Monroe Counties; and
9	WHEREAS, in 1840, Jabish P. Eddy trekked westward
LO	from Warren, Ohio, to the Iowa Territory and
L1	established an Indian trading post on the land of the
L <b>2</b>	Sac and Fox Indian tribes; and
L 3	WHEREAS, the Eddy trading post was a pioneer
L <b>4</b>	outpost located far west from other settlements,
L 5	established in Chief Hard Fish's village, near the
۱6	mouth of the Muchakinock Creek on the banks of the Des
L 7	Moines River; and
<b>8</b>	WHEREAS, when the Sac and Fox Indians left in 1842,
L 9	some 10 families remained around the trading post, and
20	Jabish Eddy was appointed as an Indian agent; and
21	WHEREAS, in 1843 this "new purchase" land was
22	opened to settlers and J.P. Eddy laid out 160 acres of
23	his own land for a town plot with a public square in
24	the center; and
25	WHEREAS, the town; which was later named Eddyville
26	and incorporated in 1857, quickly became a
27	transportation hub for stagecoach, steamboat, and
28	railroad traffic, as well as a terminal for the
29	Western Union telegraph line; and
30	WHEREAS, the population of Eddyville has grown from

1 some 300 residents in 1851 to some 700 residents in
 2 1878 to over 1,000 residents in 2005; and
      WHEREAS, 165 years after it began as an isolated
 4 trading post, Eddyville is now home to a vast billion-
 5 dollar biotechnology complex employing over 1,000
 6 Iowans; and
      WHEREAS, the city of Eddyville is celebrating its
 7
 8 165th anniversary with a community celebration on July
 9 9, 2005; NOW THEREFORE,
