A Resolution requesting the establishment of a
legislative interim study committee to review the
private instruction requirements for school-age
children set forth in the Iowa Code.
WHEREAS, Iowa's private instruction law,
colloquially known as Iowa's home schooling law, was
enacted in 1991; and
WHEREAS, though the law has served the majority of
students placed in competent private instruction well,
abuse of this educational opportunity has occurred;
NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,
That the legislative council is requested to establish
an interim study committee to review Iowa's private
instruction law, set forth in Code chapter 299A, and
the rules the state board of education has adopted to
implement the law, in order to, at a minimum, consider
the benefits and disadvantages of the law and
determine whether the law and the rules provide
sufficient safeguards to ensure that children placed
under competent private instruction are adequately
protected from abusive situations, and to submit its
findings and recommendations in a report to the
general assembly by December 15, 2005.
