EXPLANATION 2 This bill addresses governmental services involving audit 2 8 reports and the family investment program administered by the 2 9 department of human services. 2 10 Code section 11.28, relating to individual audit reports 11 made by the auditor of state giving the results of all 2 2 12 examinations and audits of all departments and establishments 2 13 and all fiscal officers of the state and local governments, is 2 14 amended. A requirement to report the annual cost per year for 2 15 each inmate, member, or student is revised to require 2 16 reporting of the average cost per year for inmates, members, 2 17 clients, patients, and students served. In addition, the 2 18 sentence structure of the section is revised. 2 19 A family investment program (FIP) agreement limitation is
