 A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to purchases made by state agencies using a state 2 procurement card.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4 TLSB 3194HC 81 5 jr/cf/24 PAG LIN Section 1. Section 8A.302, subsection 1, Code 2005, is 2 amended to read as follows: 1. <u>a.</u> Providing a system of uniform standards and 4 specifications for purchasing. When the system is developed, 5 all items of general use shall be purchased by state agencies 6 through the department, except items used by the state 7 department of transportation, institutions under the control 1 8 of the state board of regents, the department for the blind, 1 9 and any other agencies exempted by law. However, items of 1 10 general use may be purchased through the department by any 1 11 governmental entity. b. In addition to this system, the department shall adopt 13 rules, pursuant to chapter 17A, establishing standards for the 14 organization and operation of a procurement card program. 15 program shall be the sole source of procurement cards for 16 state agencies, notwithstanding any other provision of this 17 subsection to the contrary. The goal of the program is to 18 facilitate purchasing of items costing less than one thousand 19 dollars by state agencies, which are not otherwise available 20 through the system or otherwise through a state contract. 21 Agency participation in the program is subject to annual 22 authorization by the department. An agency shall not be 23 authorized to participate in the procurement card program 24 unless it demonstrates, to the satisfaction of the department, 25 that the cost of procurement card purchases would be 26 comparable in cost to purchases made through a state contract 27 or other procurement procedures. The standards shall be designed to promote economy, 29 accountability, and efficiency in the procurement process and 30 shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
31 (1) Annual limits for the aggregate value of purchases 32 made by each agency under the program and specific limits for 33 each card and the number of cards that may be issued to an 34 agency and an individual employed by the agency. (2) Approval by the department of every card account that is established and approval of any individual employee who is 2 to be issued a procurement card. (3) Internal management and auditing procedures that each 4 agency must follow to ensure proper usage of the program. (4) A monitoring process to be used by the department to prevent abuse of the program. (5) An annual report to the department, by each 8 participating agency, detailing purchases made under the 9 program. 2 10 EXPLANATION 2 11 This bill establishes a program to be administered by the 2 12 department of administrative services for the use of 2 13 procurement cards by state agencies in making purchases of 2 14 items costing less than \$1,000. The cards are to be used as 2 15 an alternative to purchasing through a state contract or some 2 16 other procurement process. The department of administrative

2 17 services is required to promulgate rules detailing the 2 18 organization and operation of the program, and must annually
