EXPLANATION

This bill makes appropriations for FY 2005=2006 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first fund, tax= exempt bond proceeds restricted capital funds account of the tobacco settlement trust fund, and vertical infrastructure 20 10 fund for various capital and other projects. Appropriations 20 11 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund include projects for 20 12 the departments of administrative services, corrections, 20 13 cultural affairs, economic development, education, human 20 14 services, natural resources, public safety, and 20 15 transportation, and the national program for playground 20 16 safety, Iowa state fair authority, and state board of regents. 20 17 The bill also appropriates from the rebuild Iowa

20 18 infrastructure fund for FY 2006=2007 and FY 2007=2008 for 20 19 projects of the departments of administrative services and 20 20 corrections.

The bill appropriates funds from the environment first fund 20 22 to the departments of agriculture and land stewardship, 20 23 economic development, and natural resources. The bill appropriates \$11 million from the environment first fund to 20 25 the resources enhancement and protection fund in lieu of the \$20 million appropriated by statute from the general fund of 20 27 the state.

20 28 The bill makes appropriations from the tax=exempt bond 20 29 proceeds restricted capital funds account of the tobacco 20 30 settlement trust fund for projects for the departments of 20 31 administrative services, corrections, economic development, 20 32 human services, public safety, and transportation and the Iowa

The bill also appropriates funds from the tax=exempt bond 20 35 proceeds restricted capital funds account of the tobacco 1 settlement trust fund to the state board of regents for 2 tuition replacement and to the office of the treasurer of 3 state for debt service for repayment of prison infrastructure 2.1 21 4 bonds. 21 The bill also appropriates funds from the vertical 21 infrastructure fund for capital projects of the departments of 7 administrative services, cultural affairs, economic 8 development, and public defense, and the treasurer of state. 9 Amendments to Code section 327H.20A change the railroad 21 2.1 21 21 10 revolving loan fund to the railroad revolving loan and grant 21 11 fund to allow moneys in the fund to be used for both grants 21 12 and loans for rail economic development projects and for rail 21 13 assistance purposes. No more than 50 percent of available 21 14 moneys may be awarded as grants in any year, and the state 21 15 department of transportation may limit the grant amount that 21 16 may be awarded for a given project.
