## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the privacy of wireless communications service subscribers, including restrictions on the provision of

wireless telephone number information, and providing penalties

and remedies.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 477A.1 DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise

3 requires: "Person" shall have the same meaning as defined in 1.

section 4.1.
2. "Subscriber" means the person or persons contractually 5 6 obligated to pay a wireless communications service provider for the receipt of wireless communications services. 8

3. "Wireless communications service" shall have the same

10 meaning as defined in section 34A.7A.
11 4. "Wireless telephone number information" means the 1 12 wireless telephone number, electronic address, or any other 1 13 identifying information by which a calling party may reach a 1 14 subscriber to a wireless communications service and includes

1 15 such subscriber's name and address. Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 477A.2 WIRELESS SUBSCRIBER PRIVACY 1 17 PROTECTION.

- 1. A provider of wireless communications service shall not 1 19 sell, provide, publish, or otherwise disseminate the wireless 1 20 telephone number information of any subscriber to any person 21 except the subscriber without the subscriber's express written 1 22 consent that meets all of the following requirements:
  - a. The consent shall be contained in a separate document,
  - 24 signed and dated by the subscriber. 25 b. The consent shall contain all of the following

1 26 provisions in unambiguous and plain language:

- That by signing the document the subscriber is 2.7 (1) 28 consenting to have the subscriber's wireless telephone number 1 29 information sold or published as part of a list of subscribers 1 30 and may be included in a publicly available directory.
- That the subscriber may revoke consent at any time. That the subscriber shall not be charged for revoking (2) (3) 1 33 consent.
  - (4) If under the subscriber's calling plan the subscriber 35 may be billed for receiving unsolicited calls or text 1 messaging from a telemarketer or other person, the provider's 2 consent form shall include a disclosure that by consenting the 3 subscriber may incur additional charges for receiving 4 unsolicited calls or text messages.
  - c. A copy of the signed consent shall be provided to the 6 subscriber.
  - 2. A subscriber who provides consent pursuant to 8 subsection 1 may revoke that consent at any time, and the 9 provider shall comply with the request to revoke consent 10 within sixty days.
- 2 11 3. A provider of wireless communications service shall not 12 charge a fee to any subscriber for exercising any rights 13 granted under this chapter.
- 2 14 4. This section shall not apply to the provision of 2 15 wireless telephone number information to the following parties 2 16 for the purposes indicated:

To any law enforcement agency, fire protection agency, 2 18 public health agency, public environmental health agency, or 2 19 city or county emergency services agency for the exclusive 2 20 purpose of responding to a 911 call or communicating an 2 21 imminent threat to life or property.

b. To a telephone company providing service between 23 service areas, or to third parties for the limited purpose of

24 providing billing services.

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- c. To a telephone company to effectuate a subscriber's 26 request to transfer the subscriber's assigned telephone number 27 from the subscriber's existing provider of telecommunications 2 28 services to a new provider of telecommunications services.
  - d. In response to a lawful subpoena or process issued 30 under state or federal law.

A violation of this chapter is an unlawful practice under 34 section 714.16. All the powers conferred upon the attorney 35 general to accomplish the objectives and carry out the duties 1 prescribed pursuant to section 714.16 are also conferred upon 2 the attorney general to enforce this chapter, including, but 3 not limited to, the power to issue subpoenas, adopt rules 4 pursuant to chapter 17A, and seek injunctive relief and civil 5 penalties.

## EXPLANATION

This bill creates new Code chapter 477A establishing 8 restrictions on the dissemination of wireless telephone information by wireless communications service providers.

The bill requires wireless communications service providers 3 11 to obtain express written consent from a subscriber before the 3 12 provider may sell, provide, publish, or otherwise disseminate 3 13 a subscriber's wireless telephone number information to any 3 14 person other than the subscriber. The express consent must be 15 contained in a separate document and signed and dated by the 3 16 subscriber. The consent must explain in unambiguous and plain 3 17 language that by signing the consent the subscriber agrees to 3 18 have the subscriber's wireless telephone number sold or 3 19 published as part of a directory that may be made available to 3 20 the public. The consent must also explain that the subscriber 3 21 may revoke the consent at any time at no charge to the 22 subscriber and that the subscriber may incur additional 23 charges for receiving unsolicited calls or text messages if 3 24 the subscriber's calling plan may be so charged.

The provider must provide the subscriber a copy of the 26 consent and must comply with a subscriber's request to revoke 3 27 the consent within 60 days. Providers of wireless 3 28 communications service shall not charge a fee to a subscriber

29 for exercising any rights under new Code chapter 477A.
30 Wireless communications service providers may provide 31 wireless telephone number information without express consent 32 to a law enforcement agency, fire protection agency, public 33 health agency, public environmental health agency, or city or 34 county emergency services agency to assist in the response to 35 a 911 call or the communication of an imminent threat to life or property. Wireless telephone number information may also 2 be provided to a telephone company providing service to the 3 subscriber between service areas, to third parties providing 4 billing services, to a telephone company effectuating a 5 subscriber's request to transfer the subscriber's telephone 6 number to a different provider, and in response to a subpoena 7 or other legal process.

8 The bill provides that the attorney general can enforce 9 Code chapter 477A in the manner of a violation of Code section 10 714.16 relating to consumer frauds.

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
