EFFECTIVE AND RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY DATES. 14 25 Sec. 28. 14 26 This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect 14 27 upon enactment and is retroactively applicable to June 9, 14 28 2005. 14 29 EXPLANATION 14 30 This bill makes appropriations and transfers from the 14 31 general fund of the state to the department of economic 14 32 development, the university of Iowa, the university of 14 33 northern Iowa, Iowa state university, the department of 14 34 workforce development, and the public employment relations 14 35 board for the 2006=2007 fiscal year. The bill provides that the goals for the department of 15 1 15 2 economic development shall be to expand and stimulate the 3 state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and increase the 4 population of the state. 15 15 15 The bill appropriates from loan repayments on loans under 5 15 6 the former rural community 2000 program to the department of 15 economic development moneys for providing financial assistance 7 8 to Iowa's councils of governments that provide technical and 15 15 9 planning assistance to local governments and for the rural 15 10 development program for the purposes of the program including 15 11 the rural enterprise fund and collaborative skills development 15 12 training. 15 13 The bill appropriates moneys collected by the division of 15 14 insurance in excess of the anticipated gross revenues to the 15 15 department of economic development for purposes of insurance 15 16 economic development and international insurance economic 15 17 development. 15 18 The bill appropriates moneys from the Iowa community 15 19 development loan fund to the department of economic 15 20 development for purposes of the community development program. 15 21 The bill appropriates moneys from the workforce development 15 22 fund account to the workforce development fund. 15 23 The bill provides that moneys appropriated or transferred 15 24 to or receipts credited to the workforce development fund may 15 25 be used for administration of workforce development 15 26 activities. 15 27 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of the 15 28 state to the Iowa finance authority for the entrepreneurs with 15 29 disabilities program. The bill provides that all moneys remaining in the job training fund on July 1, 2006, and any moneys appropriated or 15 30 15 31 15 32 credited to the fund during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 15 33 2006, shall be transferred to the workforce development fund. 15 34 The bill requires the state board of regents to submit a 15 35 report on the progress of regents institutions in meeting the 16 1 strategic plan for technology transfer and economic 16 2 development. 16 The bill appropriates moneys from the special employment ২ 16 4 security contingency fund to the department of workforce development for the division of workers' compensation. 16 5 16 6 The bill provides that, in addition to other purposes, Iowa 16 7 state university shall use moneys from the grow Iowa values 16 8 fund for purposes of developing business succession plans at

16 9 small business development centers. The bill eliminates a 16 10 dollar=for=dollar local match requirement for financial 16 11 assistance for small business development centers and only 16 12 requires local matching moneys to be obtained. The bill 16 13 eliminates a limit of \$20,000 for such financial assistance. 16 14 These provisions take effect upon enactment and apply 16 15 retroactively to June 9, 2005. 16 16 The bill provides that a pe The bill provides that a person who earns less than \$10,000 16 17 annually or who performs work or has work performed on the 16 18 person's own property is not a contractor for purposes of Code 16 19 chapter 91C and is exempt from contractor fee requirements. The bill eliminates an appropriation from the general fund 16 20 16 21 of the state to the department of workforce development for FY 16 22 2006=2007 for workforce development field offices. 16 23 The bill includes a directive for the department The bill includes a directive for the departments and 16 24 independent agencies receiving an appropriation in the bill to 16 25 review employee policy for daily or short=term travel and to 16 26 implement policy revisions to maximize cost savings and 16 27 minimize oil consumption. The directive includes requirements 16 28 for reporting to the committees on government oversight. 16 29 The bill allows the office of renewable fuels and 16 30 coproducts to apply to the department of economic development 16 31 for moneys in the value=added agricultural products and 16 32 processes financial assistance fund for deposit in the 16 33 renewable fuels and coproducts fund. 16 34 The bill provides that, for the fiscal year beginning July 16 35 1, 2006, any entity that was specifically identified in 2001 17 1 Iowa Acts, chapter 188, to receive funding from the department 17 2 of economic development, excluding any entity identified to 17 3 receive a direct appropriation beginning July 1, 2006, may 17 4 apply to the department for assistance through the appropriate 17 5 program. 17 The bill provides that, in providing moneys from the 6 shelter assistance fund to homeless shelter programs, the 17 7 17 8 department of economic development shall explore the potential 17 of allocating moneys to programs based in part on their 9 17 10 ability to move their clients toward self=sufficiency.
