The board of educational examiners consists of eleven 2 19 2 20 members. Two must be members of the general public and the 2 21 remaining nine must be licensed practitioners. One of the 2 22 public members shall <del>also be the director of the department of 2 23 education, or the director's designee</del> <u>have served on a school</u> 24 board. The other public member members shall be a person who 2 25 does not hold never have held a practitioner's license, but 2 26 has shall have a demonstrated interest in education. One of 27 the licensed practitioners shall be the director of the 28 department of education or the director's designee. The nine 2 29 remaining eight practitioners shall be selected from the 2 30 following areas and specialties of the teaching profession: 2 31 Sec. 6. Section 272.3, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code 2005, 32 is amended to read as follows:

A majority of the licensed practitioner members shall be 34 nonadministrative practitioners. Four of the members shall be 35 administrators. Membership of the board shall comply with the 1 requirements of sections 69.16 and 69.16A. A quorum of the 2 board shall consist of six members. The director of the 3 department of education Members shall serve as the elect a 4 chairperson of the board. Members, except for the director of 5 the department of education, shall be appointed by the 6 governor and the appointments are subject to confirmation by the senate.

Sec. 7. Section 272.29, Code Supplement 2005, is amended 9 to read as follows:

272.29 ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE RULES REVIEW.

The executive director shall annually review the 3 12 administrative rules adopted pursuant to this chapter and 3 13 related state laws. The executive director shall annually 14 submit the executive director's findings and recommendations 3 15 in a report every three years to the board and the 3 16 chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house 3 17 standing committees on education and the joint appropriations 3 18 subcommittee on education by January 15. EXPLANATION

This bill amends a number of provisions related to the 21 membership, authority, and duties of the board of educational 3 22 examiners.

The bill requires the board of educational examiners to 24 adopt rules to require that a background investigation be 25 conducted on an initial applicant for a license by the 3 26 division of criminal investigation of the department of public 27 safety. The bill also requires the board to review the sex 28 offender registry, and the child and dependent adult abuse 3 29 registries for information regarding applicants for license 3 30 renewal. The bill also requires the board to access sex 31 offender registry information. The bill authorizes access to 32 the various registries by the board for purposes of issuing, 33 renewing, and revoking licenses, certificates, and 34 authorizations.

The bill eliminates the time by which the board of 1 educational examiners must resolve a written complaint filed 2 by an individual who has knowledge of an alleged violation of 3 regulations imposed on teachers and other educational 4 practitioners. Currently, the Code requires that complaints 5 be resolved within 180 days. The bill requires that the board 6 investigate such complaints and determine probable cause 7 within 120 days. Under both the current Code and the bill, if 8 good cause can be shown, the time limitations may be extended.

The bill changes the composition of the membership of the 4 10 board of educational examiners by striking language that 4 11 requires that the director of the department of education 4 12 serve as the chairperson of the board. The bill requires that 13 the director or the director's designee serve as one of the 4 14 nine licensed practitioners on the board. The bill requires 4 15 that the board's two public members shall never have held a 4 16 practitioner's license, and one of the public members shall 4 17 have served on a school board.

The bill also extends the interval, from annually to once 19 every three years, between successive administrative rules 20 review reports the executive director of the board is required 4 21 to provide to the chairpersons and ranking members of the 22 standing education committees and the joint appropriations 23 subcommittee on education.

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
