A BILL FOR 1 An Act requiring performance of a criminal history check of applicants for real estate broker and salesperson licenses. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 543B.15, Code 2005, is amended by 2 adding the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 10. An applicant for an initial real
- 4 estate broker's or salesperson's license shall be subject to a
- 5 national criminal history check through the federal bureau of
- 6 investigation. The applicant shall request the criminal
- 7 history check and shall provide the applicant's fingerprints
- 8 to the department of public safety for submission through the
- 9 state criminal history repository to the federal bureau of
- 10 investigation. The applicant shall authorize release of the
- ll results of the criminal history check to the real estate
- 12 commission. The applicant shall pay the actual cost of the
- 13 fingerprinting and criminal history check, if any. Unless the
- 14 criminal history check was completed within the ninety
- 15 calendar days prior to the date the license application is
- 16 received by the real estate commission, the commission shall
- 17 reject and return the application to the applicant. The
- 18 results of a criminal history check conducted pursuant to this
- 19 subsection shall not be considered a public record under
- 20 chapter 22.
- 21 EXPLANATION
- 22 This bill amends Code section 543B.15, relating to real
- 23 estate licensee qualifications, to require performance of a
- 24 national criminal history check of applicants for an initial
- 25 real estate broker's or salesperson's license.
- 26 The applicant must request the criminal history check to be
- 27 performed by the department of public safety and provide the
- 28 department with the applicant's fingerprints for submission to
- 29 the federal bureau of investigation. The applicant must
- 30 authorize release of the results of the criminal history check
- 31 to the real estate commission and pay for the actual costs of
- 32 fingerprinting and the criminal history check. Unless the
- 33 criminal history check was completed within the 90-calendar-
- 34 day period prior to the date a license application is received
- 35 by the commission, the commission must reject and return the

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l application to the applicant. The bill provides that the
 2 criminal history check results are not a public record under
 3 Code chapter 22, Iowa's public record law.
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
